

Counter notice (temporary event notice) - permitted temporary activities

On 15 June 2012 the licensing authority received from you, Mike Baxter a temporary event notice ("the notice") in respect of proposed temporary licensable activities due to take place on 1 July 2012 at 68 London Street Norwich NR2 1JT, nightclub on London Street. The licensing authority has received an objection under Section 104(2) of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act").

The objection which applies is indicated by an 'X' in the following table.

Objection	Insert 'X' as applicable
A chief officer of police for any police area in which the premises are situated is satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine a licensing objective.	
A local authority exercising environmental health functions for the area in which the premises are situated is satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice would undermine a licensing objective.	X

A copy of this counter notice will be sent to the chief of police and the local authority exercising environmental health functions for the area in which the premises specified in the late temporary event notice you gave is situated.

The Licensing Act 2003 does not make provision for you to appeal against this counter notice.

Under Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, a person commits an offence if he/she carries on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation; or if he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on. A person convicted of such an offence is liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £20,000, or to both.
