# Report

- 1. At its meeting on 15 January, cabinet agreed to provide temporary senior management support to Great Yarmouth Borough Council to cover the serious illness of its chief executive. Cabinet agreed that the city council's chief executive, Laura McGillivray, will temporarily become the interim chief executive of Great Yarmouth Borough Council. This will be on a 2 day per week secondment basis for a short-term period of between three and six months.
- 2. As part of that temporary support, Great Yarmouth Borough Council has appointed Laura McGillivray to undertake its statutory role of returning officer.
- 3. It is clearly not practical to undertake that role for two local authorities simultaneously, particularly in respect of overseeing the election count process.
- 4. It is therefore proposed that Russell O'Keefe, executive head of strategy, people and democracy be appointed as Norwich City Council returning officer for the duration of the temporary management support arrangements being provided to Great Yarmouth Borough Council.
