Determination-: The Committee heard the application for the grant of a premises licence at the above premises. The application asked for;

Opening Hours 06:00-23:00 Monday -Sunday

Supply of alcohol 06:00-23:00 Monday-Sunday

Those present were the Members of the committee (above) and;

Mr Jeremy Bark, Solicitor (for Tesco's Ltd) & Mr Lawrence Store Manager.

Reverend David Dewing and Rio (of Seventh Day Adventist Church).

There were no representations received from the Responsible Authorities.

Representations were received from one Interested party namely The Seventh Day Adventist Church, 133 Dereham Road, Norwich.

These were representations in respect of noise nuisance and parking affecting the neighbourhood. It was mooted that the sale of alcohol would encourage persons to misbehave and cause public order problems together with the dumping of cans and bottles in the car park at the church which is near to the store. The car park is used by staff at Notre Dame and church goers on Fridays and Saturdays.

Tesco's representatives gave assurances that the store offered a think 25 policy together with comprehensive training given to staff, they had a neighbourhood champion who would ensure that the curtilage of the store was cleaned at regular intervals and that certain types of alcohol such as Special Brew was not sold at the store. There would also be CCTV coverage of the car park at the store. There would be no deliveries before 9am and the waste is recycled by Tesco's Ltd.

The Committee's Decision-:

The Committee granted the application as asked for.

The Committee's Reasons-:

The Committee considered the representations made. There was no evidence before the committee that problems with the church & car park would be caused by the sale of alcohol at the premises and the applicant was a national company who had a great deal of experience in the running of stores with a premises licence.

Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority.

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant objection, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition of any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
