Hunger in the UK

In 2014, the very poorest households required 41% of income to cover the costs of food, housing and fuel (Family Spending 2015 edition, ONS)

The number of anaemic infants in 2011 reached its highest level in two decades (HoC library analysis of World Bank Data)

There was an increase of 43% between 2010 and 2014 in the number of people admitted to hospital in an emergency who are found to be suffering from malnutrition (Health and Social Care Information Centre)

At one school in Birkenhead, teachers estimate that 143 children arrive hungry each day, equating to 27% of the school population
