Report

Background

- 1. Section 115E of the Highways Act 1980 (The Act) provides for a council to grant a person permission to use objects or structures on certain categories of highway for a purpose which will result in the production of income.
- 2. The Act also provides for a council to attach such conditions as they think fit to a permission granted under Section 115E. The council has adopted standard conditions in respect of permissions to use objects or structures on the highway and these are attached as appendix A to the report.
- 3. The Act gives councils a wide discretion to determine such applications and to impose conditions. Each case must be considered on its own merits with due weight being given to relevant considerations only. Existing policies or guidelines should not be applied so rigidly that an exercise of discretion in each individual case is precluded. Accordingly, the adopted standard conditions could be added to or amended depending on the circumstances of each individual application.

The application

- 4. An application has been submitted in respect of Louis Marchesi, 17 Tombland Norwich NR3 1HF seeking to place 15 tables and 60 chairs on the highway between the hours of 11:00 to 22:00 on Sunday, 17:00 to 22:00 on Monday and 12:00 to 22:00 Tuesday to Saturday (original application was for 19 tables and 76 chairs but was amended due to social distancing).
- 5. A copy of the application, accompanying photographs and location plans are attached at appendix B to the report.

- 6. In accordance with The Act, appropriate notices have been placed on the street. Notification of the application has also been given to Chatterbox (the talking newspaper for the visually impaired) and the Norwich Access Group.
- 7. Details of the application have also been forwarded to the Norfolk Constabulary, Norfolk Fire Service and the City Council's Planning, Transportation and Landscape, Health and Safety and Pollution Control sections for comment.

Tables and Chairs Licence – Standard Conditions

- The Council's reasonable expenses in connection with the granting of this permission shall have been paid and the annual fee starting with the date of this permission shall have been paid before the permission is first exercised.
- The Licensee shall indemnify the Council against any claim whatsoever, in respect of injury, damage or loss arising out of the grant of this permission other than injury, damage or loss which is attributable to the negligence of the Council.
- The objects or structures shall be placed only on the licensed area and on no other part of the public highway.
- The objects or structures shall be used only for the purposes stated above and only in connection with the premises.
- The objects or structures shall be removed from the public highway forthwith upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden.
- The objects or structures shall be removed from the public highway forthwith to enable the passage of any emergency service vehicles or any vehicle engaged on the repair or maintenance of the public highway or apparatus within the public highway or any other vehicle authorised by the Council to proceed on the public highway.
- 7 Permission for the tables and chairs is granted from (time of day/month of year) to (time of day/month of year) (subject to earlier termination under clause 13).
- 8 No amplified music or live music shall take place on the licensed area.
- 9 The tables and chairs, the subject of this Licence, shall be removed from the licensed area each day outside of the licence period.
- The Licensee shall ensure that the licensed area is mainly enclosed by a barrier that is in keeping with the visual appearance of the area, not less than 800mm high and with no more than 150mm between the base rail and the ground, or other design as previously agreed in writing by the Council. Neither the barrier nor other furniture should carry strident advertising that goes beyond the purpose of discreetly identifying that the pavement cafe is associated with a particular business.
- The Licensee undertakes to ensure that the licensed area is closely monitored and kept clean and tidy at all times.

- No alteration to the highway surface shall be permitted to be carried out by the Licensee in implementing this Licence
- The Council may, by service of a notice in writing on the Licensee or owner of the premises, withdraw the Licence forthwith:-
 - (a) in an emergency or in the event that the Council considers the exercise of the Licence causes a substantial and unreasonable obstruction of the right of the public to pass or re-pass on the public highway,
 - (b) if any condition of this permission is broken,
 - (c) if the Council considers it to be necessary in connection with the exercise of any of its functions or the functions of any statutory undertaker or public utility,
 - (d) for any other reasonable cause.
- The Licensee shall inform the Council's Head of Citywide Services in writing of any change in the owner or occupier of the premises within one month of that change.
- This permission is for tables and chairs and barriers only. No other items, for example space heaters, are permitted by this licence.

I refer to the current application under the Highways Act 1980 by the operators of the Louis Marchesi Public House to use part of the footway immediately in front of my clients' homes within the Samson and Hercules building for assembly and the serving of alcoholic drinks. My clients' Mr N. Stannage, Ms S. Moss, Ms S. Hyde, Ms E. Bidwell and Mr P Wells as residents all wish to object in the strongest possible terms to the current application.

My clients reside within flats formed through the lawful conversion of a listed building. All dwelling units within the building have limited window openings and the converted dwellings have low levels of natural ventilation and light. All rely on ventilation through window openings in the elevation of the building fronting onto the application area. My clients are deeply concerned that their living spaces will be contaminated through the planned open air drinking venue within 2m of the windows serving their dwellings.

My clients are concerned that the application proposals will have an unacceptable impacts on their residential amenities and mental health in an already difficult time. They do not wish to have their living spaces contaminated with secondary tobacco smoking, elevated background noise and the real risk of short distance Covid-19 disease transmission. The application proposals in the current form are completely unacceptable to my clients.

My clients all recognize the unusual circumstances that we are all living through but the application is site is simply the wrong location for this proposed use. It is important that the Licensing Department do not allow the publican's difficult situation to contaminate my clients' lives and living environments.

I trust that this representation is made on-time and that the potential for uncontrolled neighbor nuisance is recognized and the application is refused without further delay to protect my clients' mental health.

The plan on the application is very poor. It is difficult to see what the plan is.

I note there are going to be 19 tables and 76 chairs. That is a lot and will take up space. Note that outside the Sampson and Hercules there is a layby for delivery vehicles and it is not footway - there tends to be a vehicle parked there. So add chairs and you have an access issue for pedestrians, blind, those with push chairs or in wheelchairs.

You need to fully assess and show the impact on the width of the footway this proposal will have. Is the new width acceptable for such a busy route to and from the city and for all users? It does not seem so.

Thank you for your letter dated 29th June 2020, which referred to the above application for a Tables and Chairs Licence to place 15 x Tables and 60 x Chairs outside The Louis Marchesi Public House, 17 Tombland, Norwich between 11.00 hrs and 22.00 hrs on Sunday, 17.00 hrs – 22,00 hrs on Monday and 12.00 hrs – 22.00 hrs on Tuesday – Saturday.

I can confirm that Norfolk Constabulary Traffic Management have no objections to this application (subject to the below), providing there is no obstruction to pedestrian movement pass this area, and no trip hazard to members of the public who may be partially sighted. Minimum width allowance for pedestrian movement should also consider other street furniture present such as posts, post boxes etc.

In respect of the tables and chairs at the Waggon and Horses Lane end of the Louis Marchesi, a clear width of 1.2 meters should be provided, to allow a mobility scooter to pass without any hindrance. This is particularly relevant to the table and chairs closest to the Waggon and Horses Lane end of the premises so as not to cause an obstruction of the highway and free pedestrian movement.
