

## **NOTICE OF DETERMINATION**

### Date of Hearing: 13 October 2010

**Licence Type:** application for Variation of a Premises Licence

Name of Applicant: Warren Bryant

Name of Premises: The Workshop

Postal Address of Premises: 53, Earlham Road, Norwich.NR2 3AD

Licensing Sub-Committee: Councillors Hooke (Chair) Banham & Lay

**Determination-** The committee noted that the applicant amended his operating schedule following discussion with environmental health officers and the tables at the front of the premises will not be used after 22:30hours and patrons will not be allowed to smoke in this area between 22:00hours and 10:00hours. The applicant amended the operating schedule in that the rear garden area to be used by patrons is defined as 4.65m in length beginning from the back wall of the premises building and will run width wise adjacent to the woven fence line. The operating schedule is amended as set out below;

Increasing the number of chairs at the front of the premises, from 9-12.

Removing the restriction on use of the rear garden except for access and allows use of that area by customers until 22:30hours between 1<sup>st</sup> April and 30 September each year.

No smoking at the front of the premises between 22:00hours and 10:00hours and

The tables at the front area will not be used between 22:30hours and 10:00hours

#### The Committee's Decision:

The Committee decided to grant the application (as amended at the hearing)

#### The Committee's reasons:

The committee took note of all the concerns voiced by local residents and of the chronology presented by Mrs Delaney. They have also noted the expressions of support for the application. The committee made a site visit to both the premises and Mrs Delaney and Mrs Frosts' homes. They noted that the environmental officers have withdrawn their representations following discussion with the applicant. The committee also took note of the survey regarding transport to the premises carried out by the applicant. The committee felt that the conditions contained within the operating schedule did promote the licensing objectives.

# Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority.

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant objection, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition of any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
