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#### Introduction

1. From 1 October 2010 the City Council will be entering into a new shared legal service with Norfolk County Council and Great Yarmouth Borough Council. The shared service will be called nplaw (Norfolk Public Law) and will handle all legal work for the three authorities as well as work for other clients including Broadland District Council and the Broads Authority. The shared service will be hosted by the Norfolk County Council and 12 City Council Legal Services employees will TUPE transfer to the County Council.

# **Monitoring Officer**

- 2. Under the new arrangement, a team within nplaw will advise on constitution and standard related issues for the three stakeholder authorities (including the role of Monitoring Officer).
- 3. The Monitoring Officer for Norfolk County Council will be Victoria McNeill (Practice Director for nplaw) and for Great Yarmouth Borough Council, Chris Skinner (ex Great Yarmouth Borough Council solicitor). It is proposed that the same arrangement be put in place for the City Council and that David Johnson is appointed as the Monitoring Officer for the City Council.
- 4. In order to fulfil statutory requirements these officers are deemed to be seconded to the relevant authority for these purposes.
