Report

Background

- 1. Every year the Audit Commission conducts a fraud survey to collect data on various frauds and acts of corruption in local government and related bodies. This report gives details of the council's response to the 2010-11 survey.
- 2. The Audit Commission needs the data to:
 - Inform the publication of Protecting the Public Purse. The 2011 report can be found at <u>http://www.audit-commission.gov.uk/fraud/protecting-thepublic-purse/Pages/ppp2011.aspx</u>
 - Provide a summary of current and emerging fraud risks in the public sector
 - Inform the National Fraud Authority's annual assessment of the total value of fraud in the UK.
- 3. Submission of the information is required under section 48 of the Audit Commission Act 1998.
- 4. Responding to the survey is by way of a website portal, but a copy of our submission is attached at **annex 1** for members' information and review.

Key messages from the survey submission

- 5. In 2010-11 the council reported:
 - 109 cases of housing and council tax benefit fraud. This should be seen in the context of approximately 20,000 claimants as at the end of March 2011. There were six cases where the reported fraud value was over £10,000 (see Q.19.1 of the survey).
 - 36 successful prosecutions for housing and council tax benefit fraud
 - Six cases of housing sub-letting fraud (see Q.3.3), resulting in all six properties being reclaimed. N.B. These six cases are also included in Q.19.1, which asks for details of fraud cases over £10,000 (these are reported to the Audit Commission individually on form AF70). Although not specifically mentioned in the question, the Audit Commission confirmed that all housing frauds, also reported on form AF70 but without values, should be included in our response.
 - One case of council tax fraud in relation to single person discount
 - No cases of corruption.
- 6. For 2010-11 the council was able to give a positive response to Q.25, which reflects the improvements made to our counter fraud arrangements.
- 7. The survey has highlighted that further improvements can be made to our antimoney laundering and whistleblowing arrangements. These will be addressed during 2011-12.

Conclusion

8. The results of the survey will be used to inform the council's risk assessment for fraud and corruption and subsequent counter fraud plans and activity, which will be regularly reported to audit committee.
