#### 1. Appointment of chair

**RESOLVED** to appoint Councillor Wright as the chair for the ensuing civic year.

#### 5. Twinning fund – financial position and update

The head of legal and procurement presented the report. She highlighted the twinning fund and the ability for the twinning associations to submit grant applications to the democratic and elections manager.

#### 6. Update on the Uru-Eu-Wau-Wau Friendship Link

The chair introduced the item. The representative was unable to attend the meeting but a written report had been included. Members commented that they were looking forward to future updates to committee.

### 7. Reports of the twinning associations

#### Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association

As representatives from Rouen were unable to attend the meeting, the Lord Mayor provided an update. He had been invited to visit Rouen to sign a new memorandum of understanding. This would extend the existing links with the city. Rouen was on the shortlist to be European Capital of Culture 2028.

#### Norfolk and Norwich Koblenz Friendship Association

Bob Young updated the committee on the activities of the Norfolk and Norwich Koblenz Friendship Association. Membership numbers were remaining fairly stable but unfortunately some members had passed away. The association was still looking at ensuring that the link in Koblenz would remain, as the current group would wind up by 2025. In response to the Lord Mayor's question, Bob Young said that a joint letter to Koblenz signed by the Lord Mayor would be appreciated. A member suggested contacting the local press in Koblenz to highlight the issue.

The Norfolk and Norwich Koblenz Friendship Association and the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association had been contacted by Cringleford Junior Football Club who were looking to hold an international football tournament in the summer 2024. Bob Young had reached out to school in Koblenz to find out if they would be interested in joining.

The association had hosted another Southern Comfort boat trip on the Norfolk Broads has it had done in the previous year. This had been well attended and had received positive feedback.

#### Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association

Carole Kenney provided an update. As the widow of Paul Cross, she highlighted that the reception for the Paul Cross memorial concert had been hosted in her home, however as she no longer lived in Norwich the association was looking for an appropriate venue. As previously reported to the committee the association was also looking at moving the concert to a date in the summer. A new member had recently joined the association who was involved with the arts in Novi Sad.

The Lord Mayor said it was positive to see links with Novi Sad continuing to develop.

#### Purpose:

#### **Policy Framework**

The Council has five corporate priorities, which are:

- People live independently and well in a diverse and safe city.
- Norwich is a sustainable and healthy city.
- Norwich has the infrastructure and housing it needs to be a successful city.
- The city has an inclusive economy in which residents have equal opportunity to flourish.
- Norwich City Council is in good shape to serve the city.

This report helps to meet the corporate priorities of Norwich City Council is in good shape to serve the city and people live independently and well in a diverse and safe city.

#### Report

- 1. The balance of the Twinning Fund on 19 October 2023 will be £5,510
- 2. This includes the council's annual twinning contribution of £2,060 for the current financial year.
- 3. There have been no grant applications from twinning associations for specific events in the current financial year 2023-2024.
- 4. The twinning associations are encouraged to submit applications to the committee for consideration for any events planned.
- 5. Members of the committee are reminded that grant applications from twinning associations are made by completing a grant application form which is sent to the democratic and elections manager. Any applications are then considered by the twinning committee. The committee will recommend any agreed grants to the Interim Chief Finance Officer (Section 151 Officer) for approval.
- 6. At its meeting in October 2022, the twinning committee recommended using the twinning fund to purchase new twinning boards to be displayed in the civic corridor at City Hall. The cost for 5 new boards was estimated at £150 and these costs have been approved. The democratic and elections manager encourages the associations to bring forward their wording and artwork. We will start the work removing the old boards shortly.
- 7. The friendship link between Norwich and Uru-Eu-Wau Wau indigenous people based in Rondônia, Brazil has been established. The agreement is due to be signed by the Lord Mayor this month.
- 8. The council has been in contact with the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association about a football tournament including clubs from Rouen and Norfolk. The event is being held at Easton College. The association is very welcome to make a grant application to the committee to help support the event.

## 2023 Paul Cross Memorial Concert

We were all delighted to welcome back to Norwich the talented young pianist Aleksandar Djermanovic to give a recital of romantic pieces in the beautiful surroundings of St Peter Mancroft Church.

We were treated to a brilliant performance, worthy of the international concert pianist Aleksandar has become since he first performed for the NNNSA in 2015. His playing of the Beethoven piano sonata for the opening of his programme was exquisite, followed by a powerful and impressionistic rendering of the ghostlike "Der Doppelgänger" by Schubert/Liszt. Our appreciation was increased by Aleksandar's helpful introduction to the story behind the piece, reading aloud the lyrics of the song.

Similarly, in the second half of the programme, the performing of the poetry of the songs set to music by Tchaikovsky and Rachmaninov, before he played the series of songs set up a haunting atmosphere. I particularly loved the Rachmaninov / Wild "Do Not Grieve" and the Tchaikovsky /Rachmaninov "Lullaby". We could only wonder at his skill in the playing of "Gargoyles" by Liebermann, his final piece, when his fingers made the keys of the grand piano sing aloud to the heights of the medieval church.

Aleksandar received much applause at the end.

The concert was mostly attended by NNNSA members and our President The Lord Mayor of Norwich, Cllr Kevin Maguire, who gave the speech of thanks to our pianist and presented him with the gift of a painting of Norwich.

The Sheriff of Norwich, Caroline Jarrold also attended.

The concert is held annually to celebrate our twinning friendship with Novi Sad and raises funds for a project at The Milan Petrovic School for children and young people with a range of disabilities in Novi Sad.



Aleksandar had a very happy stay with Adrienne and Tony Cleary in Wattlefield during his visit, where he was able to practice and enjoy some relaxing home hospitality.

Aleksandar married Martina on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023. We wish the lovely couple great happiness together.


