# Background

- 1. Section 115E of the Highways Act 1980 (The Act) provides for a council to grant a person permission to use objects or structures on certain categories of highway for a purpose which will result in the production of income.
- 2. The Act also provides for a council to attach such conditions as they think fit to a permission granted under Section 115E. The council has adopted standard conditions in respect of permissions to use objects or structures on the highway and these are attached at Appendix A of the report.
- 3. The Act gives councils a wide discretion to determine such applications and to impose conditions. Each case must be considered on its own merits with due weight being given to relevant considerations only. Existing policies or guidelines should not be applied so rigidly that an exercise of discretion in each individual case is precluded. Accordingly, the adopted standard conditions could be added to or amended depending on the circumstances of each individual application.

## The Application

- 4. An application to place five tables and twelve chairs on the highway has been received from Inventive Leisure in respect of Revolution 6 Queen Street Norwich. A location plan, accompanying photograph and furniture details are attached at Appendix B to the report.
- 5. The requested days and times of use are Monday to Sunday between 1000 and 1700 hours.

#### Consultation

- 6. In accordance with The Act, occupiers of nearby premises have been consulted and appropriate notices have been placed on the street and in Chatterbox. The City Centre Residents Forum and the Norwich Access Group have also been notified of the application.
- 7. Details of the application have also been forwarded to the Norfolk Constabulary, Norfolk Fire Service and the City Council's Planning, Transportation and Landscape, Health and Safety and Pollution Control sections for comment.


8. Comments have been received from the responsible authorities and these are attached at Appendix C to the report.

#### Tables and Chairs Licence – Standard Conditions

- The Council's reasonable expenses in connection with the granting of this permission shall have been paid and the annual fee starting with the date of this permission shall have been paid before the permission is first exercised.
- The Licensee shall indemnify the Council against any claim whatsoever, in respect of injury, damage or loss arising out of the grant of this permission other than injury, damage or loss which is attributable to the negligence of the Council.
- The objects or structures shall be placed only on the licensed area and on no other part of the public highway.
- The objects or structures shall be used only for the purposes stated above and only in connection with the premises.
- The objects or structures shall be removed from the public highway forthwith upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden.
- The objects or structures shall be removed from the public highway forthwith to enable the passage of any emergency service vehicles or any vehicle engaged on the repair or maintenance of the public highway or apparatus within the public highway or any other vehicle authorised by the Council to proceed on the public highway.
- Permission for the tables and chairs is granted from (time of day/month of year) to (time of day/month of year) (subject to earlier termination under clause 13).
- 8 No amplified music or live music shall take place on the licensed area.
- 9 The tables and chairs, the subject of this Licence, shall be removed from the licensed area each day outside of the licence period.
- The Licensee shall ensure that the licensed area is mainly enclosed by a barrier that is in keeping with the visual appearance of the area, not less than 800mm high and with no more than 150mm between the base rail and the ground, or other design as previously agreed in writing by the Council. Neither the barrier nor other furniture should carry strident advertising that goes beyond the purpose of discreetly identifying that the pavement cafe is associated with a particular business.
- 11 The Licensee undertakes to ensure that the licensed area is closely monitored and kept clean and tidy at all times.
- No alteration to the highway surface shall be permitted to be carried out by the Licensee in implementing this Licence

- The Council may, by service of a notice in writing on the Licensee or owner of the premises, withdraw the Licence forthwith:-
  - (a) in an emergency or in the event that the Council considers the exercise of the Licence causes a substantial and unreasonable obstruction of the right of the public to pass or re-pass on the public highway,
  - (b) if any condition of this permission is broken,
  - (c) if the Council considers it to be necessary in connection with the exercise of any of its functions or the functions of any statutory undertaker or public utility,
  - (d) for any other reasonable cause.
- The Licensee shall inform the Council's Head of Legal and Democratic Services in writing of any change in the owner or occupier of the premises within one month of that change.
- This permission is for tables and chairs and barriers only. No other items, for example space heaters, are permitted by this licence.



Hi Maxine

This application for tables and chairs outside 23 White Lion Street is potentially problematic.

White Lion Street is a Pedestrian Zone between 10am and 5pm daily and as such has a high density of pedestrians

It is also routinely used for loading and unloading throughout the day as is permitted by the traffic regulation order.

At its narrowest point outside 23 White Lion Street it is 5.3 metres (towards York Alley), narrowing it by 2 metres would leave 3.3 metres which if a large delivery vehicle was passing would leave very little space for pedestrians, especially if buggies or wheelchairs were present.

Despite the obvious benefits that café culture brings to Norwich city centre it must also be balanced with the needs of vulnerable road users, their road safety and the ambience of the street once tables and chairs and their barriers reduce available roadspace.

My recommendation would be to refuse this application due to the potential detriment and safety for pedestrians.

Dear Maxine.

I have reviewed the above application and inspected the site. I would comment as follows:

The premises is situated at a pinch point near the top of White Lion Street and next door to the goods entrance of Primark. High-sided vehicles pass this point - indeed there is one such vehicle shown in the photograph accompanying the application. I need to make some more enquiries but I am also suspicious that vehicles reverse into the goods entrance of Primark judging by the high-level scuff marks on the brickwork adjacent to the Café (and which can again be seen in the photograph).

In my opinion the width of the seating area (at two meters) is rather large and would necessitate pedestrians having to make more use of the central portion of the roadway thereby making the avoidance of moving vehicles harder and increasing the likelihood of impacts.

There would however appear to be a precedence in that Costa Coffee (also on White Lion Street) has outdoor seating on that part of the road designated a footpath. Notwithstanding this I would ask that consideration be given to reducing the width of Caley's seating area to accommodate no more than a single table and three chairs to the left of the entrance door and two tables and five chairs to the right of the entrance door.

In any event I would strongly suggest that the seating area does not extend into the roadway i.e. beyond the limits of the red brick paving and road gulley shown in the photograph. This, I feel, would necessitate the removal of at least one of the tables to the right of the entrance door.

If, prior to the 2nd November deadline, I uncover any more information which alters my current thinking I shall get back to you.

#### Dear Maxine

Thank you for consulting me on the application from Caleys to place 5 tables and 12 chairs outside 23 White Lion Street.

The footfall is very high in this location in relation to the width of pedestrian space. Furthermore the pedestrian desire line runs immediately in front of the building because the street curves round into Red Lion Street. The introduction of an enclosure extending 2 metres out from the building would unacceptably restrict the amount of pavement space available and form an obstruction. I therefore object to this application. A revised application for three tables and six chairs might be acceptable.

Whilst in general tables and chairs are welcomed for the activity and vitality they bring to the street. In this case I would have concerns over the impact on the pedestrian environment. This part of the City Centre experiences extremely high levels of pedestrian movements and White Lion Street is already limited in terms of its width, it also provides for the servicing requirements to a number of retail premises in the vicinity.

I would therefore recommend refusing the application due to the potential detriment and safety for pedestrians.
