YOUR ITEM: A sustainable, inclusive Norwich economy following Covid-19.

BRIEF SCOPE: The pending recession emanating from the consequences of Covid-19 will be felt by all but particularly those with the least resources and already hard hit from 10 years of austerity. As government announces measures to potentially stimulate the economy, reviewing and refining our economic strategy to better meet both challenges and opportunities would be opportune.

TIME	is this the right time to review the issue and is there sufficient officer time and resource available? This could be an important opportunity to review the steps we can take to develop a better, sustainable and inclusive
	economy in the city to meet the challenges of the recession. Opportunities to take advantages of any investment or measures which provide security to residents will be vital.
O PPORTUNITY	what would be the objective of the scrutiny? What difference can scrutiny make?
	Review the economic strategy set within the new council recovery plan and work of the emerging Good Economy Commission to better understand opportunities to benefit Norwich residents.
PERFORMANCE	can performance in this area be improved by scrutiny input?
	Economic performance in the city is already closely monitored by the economic development team and input from scrutiny leading to outcomes which could be measurable.
PUBLIC INTEREST	what would be the public interest in placing this topic onto the work programme?

	There is widespread concern over the impact of the recession and likelihood of mass unemployment during the autumn. Public interest in initiatives and measures the city council might take to practically reduce this, but also stimulate a more positive, sustainable and inclusive future local economy should be considered.
CONTRIBUTION	will any scrutiny activity on this matter contribute to the councils activities as agreed in the corporate plan? Economic development and inclusive growth remain a key
	corporate priority of the council and the work undertaken to promote it will benefit the city strongly.
