## Report to Twinning Committee 8 October 2009.

Our **KONTAKT 2009** Summer Newsletter mentioned our two most recent events on pages 1 and 2 and the pictorial enhancements gave an idea of our expectations, which have now been superseded by the events.

Our Annual Anniversary Lunch on Sunday 13 September, being the nearest to 16 September, was in part to the memory of four of our members who had passed away, a celebration of their lives, dedicated to our Friendship Association each in their supportive ways, with Gordon Brook as a longstanding Chairman, and Paul Ashbee our archaeological inspiration.

We have just returned from our bi-annual visit to Koblenz "plus", and we all agreed it was the best ever! On page 2 of KONTAKT we gave a glimpse of the programme and some pictures of what we hoped to do. These were enhanced by the actual experience. The Winningen "Pauschal Angebot" being five treats in one day, and for this we were joined by several Koblenz members. The City Reception was hosted by the Director of Culture and Deputy Lord Mayor Detlef Knopp, who delighted us by speaking both in German and English as his own interpreter, which was highlighted in the report in the Koblenz Rhein Zeitung newspaper, and with a picture.

In our visits we went to Burg Eltz, a fairy tale castle on a ridge in a valley, surrounded by trees, Schloss Sayn with its Museum displaying cast iron of all types, even down to jewellery, and its Butterfly Garden. We enjoyed a joint friendship dinner and had scheduled in a free day for members to follow their own programme.

Andy, our driver from Spratts Coaches was on his first visit to Koblenz and looked after us extremely well.

Many projects were further discussed and especially their hope that Norwich along with other twin cities will take part in the Twinning Gardens for the BUGA 2011 National Garden Show, which takes place in Koblenz from April to October 2011. They are hoping that there will be further cultural visits in connection with the exhibition, and obviously will welcome visitors, particularly from their twin cities. Our Youth Exchange programme, with Barbara Theis (Vice Chairman to Günther Hahn) the guiding light, is needing more support, and there are more University Students needing School Placements as part of their University degree courses.

The "Immer wieder Rhein" photographic exhibition with the Norwich and District Photographic Society was extended and it is hoped that this can be displayed in Berlin, and then in Norwich. (Watch this space!).

The last of our seasonal events, the traditional Advent Evening will be on Monday 30 November at The Great Hospital.

In 2010 we will be celebrating our 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

Jill Noble and I attended the AGM of the Norfolk Association of Twin Communities, which was attended by the Chairman of the County Council, on 26 September and were pleased to learn that information of other Norfolk Twinning Links has been supplied to Dragon Hall for inclusion in the Twinning Centre there.

Our AGM for next year has been moved to Friday 19 March, hoping for more Spring-like weather.

On Sunday 27 September a new Lord Mayor for Koblenz was elected, Prof. Dr. Joachim Hofmann-Göttig was elected, and as he was canvassing in Koblenz on the Saturday, I spoke to him and gave him our information sheet.

The Handwerkskammer (Chamber of Skilled Trades) continues to have a high profile in Koblenz and it's the region of the Northern Rheinland Pfalz, with its programmes for skills training and apprenticeships. It would be very good if we could find a way of encouraging exchanges again with Norwich City College, Kings Lynn and Great Yarmouth Colleges. It is a pity that we cannot gain from the well established and successful programmes in Germany.

**Eltz Castle**, which is one of the most beautiful and best preserved castles in Germany. Lying in a romantic setting surrounded by an unspoilt landscape, inviting and majestic at the same time - like a fairy-tale castle come to life. You will find history cast in stone and you will feel yourself immersed in the spirit of a past revived - a fascinating view of the different ages of Western (Occidental) culture is waiting for you.

Eltz castle has remained in the procession of the same family for over 800 years.

The present owner of the castle, Dr. Karl Graf von und zu Eltz, known as 'Faust von Stromberg', lives in Eltville/Rhine. The family has had its main German residence there since the beginning of the 19th century. Dr. Karl Graf von und zu Eltz represents the 33rd generation of the House of Eltz. He has undertaken the task of maintaining this national monument for the public, to preserve its structure and, following family tradition, pass it on to the 34th generation. There is a restaurant on the premises.

The reconstruction of the palace, which had been destroyed during World War II, was completed in summer 2000. Now the splendour of Sayn Palace ("Schloss Sayn") is restored. Together with the castle hill and the park the neo-gothic residence of the Princes of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Sayn is the centre piece of a romantic ideal landscape. Inside, a museum has been created, where the visitor can see a multitude of artefacts from the times when Sayn was famous for its ornamental cast iron (Kunstguss). The adjacent Chamber of the Princesses offers an insight into the history and life of 6 generations of Princesses Sayn-Wittgenstein and their children etc
