## Notice of Determination

### **Determination –**

The Committee noted that there was no refuse bin secured to the outside of the premises and the applicant's undertaking that this would be remedied immediately.

That no complaints have been received by the licensing department since 2006 in relation to these premises. There had been 1 complaint in 2005 and 1 in 2006.

No objectors attended the hearing but there had been 5 objections received in writing.

That Ms Lee's own telephone number is on the customer menus and she has never received a complaint in the year she has been in this area.

The applicant will now open the premises from 7am onwards instead of 11am.

The applicant offered as conditions;

- 1) To install CCTV outside the front of the premises and to retain the imagery for a minimum of 28 days and to co-operate with the police when reporting any incidents of crime and disorder/anti- social behaviour in making the imagery available to the police.
- 2) All provision delivery to the premises to take place between 7am and 5pm.
- 3) The premises will be open for collection of foods Sunday through to Thursday until 1am and for delivery to customer addresses until 3am.

- 4) The premises will open Friday and Saturday nights for both collection of foods and delivery to customer addresses until 3am (Saturday and Sunday mornings).

**The Committee's decision:**

The Committee:

The Committee decided to grant the variation and the licence now allows the premises to open for collection of food until 1am Sunday through to Thursday with deliveries to customer addresses until 3am. On Fridays and Saturdays the premises will be open for collection of foods and delivery to customer addresses until 3am

**The Committee's reasons:**

In view of the offer to amend the licence conditions by the applicant the committee felt that the licensing objectives were being promoted and the concerns put into writing by local residents had been fully considered.

**Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority**

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant representation, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
