Background

- 1. On Thursday, March 10, 2016, an email was received from Brigitte Finkemeier, who works for Dr. Joachim Hofmann-Göttig, the Oberbürgermeister of Koblenz.
- 2. The email explained that Dr. Hofmann-Göttig would be visiting Norwich on 27 28 May 2016 and if possible would like a tour of the city to understand better the links between the two cities.
- 3. This was agreed to by the twinning officer (Andy Emms) and between he and senior committee officer Andy Futter, a two-day itinerary of visits to relevant areas and attractions within Norwich.

Day one: Friday 27 May, 2016

- 4. Andy Emms and Andy Futter arrived at the Maids Head Hotel and greeted Dr. Hofmann-Göttig, Günter Hahn and Peter Lotak.
- 5. From there, the party attended the Lord Mayor's parlour at City Hall where they met with Lord Mayor Councillor Marion Maxwell and enjoyed convivial introductions and conversation over coffee.
- Andy Emms then took the party on a brief walking tour of the city, taking in the market, the Royal Arcade and London Street before attending the Cathedral Refectory for a lunch provided by the Norfolk and Norwich Koblenz Friendship Association.
- After lunch, the visitors were met by Andy and Andy and taken on tour of the Dragon Hall / Writer's Centre by its executive director, Alison McFarlane.
- 8. A visit to the castle museum followed, during which the Oberbürgermeister was very pleased to have his request to visit the battlements accepted. The visit finished with a guided tour of the castle keep and an explanation of the plans for its renovation.
- 9. Following a brief break for a return to the hotel and a change of clothes, the civic party were joined by the Lord Mayor, Councillor Mike Stonard, Andy Emms, Andy Futter and Waltraud and Richard Jarrold at The Library Restaurant for dinner. Gifts were exchanged and all seemed to enjoy themselves.
- 10. The evening closed with the civic party and the Lord Mayor accompanied by Andy Futter attending a concert of Mozart and Hayden music at the cathedral, given by the excellent English Chamber Orchestra.

Day two: Saturday 28 May, 2016

11. At 10:45 the civic party were collected from the Maids Head Hotel by Andy and Andy and taken to the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts.

- 12. The visitors enjoyed two special exhibitions in addition to the regular collection: *Alberto Giacometti: A Line Through Time* and *Henri Cartier-Bresson: Paris.*
- 13. A short visit to Norwich International Airport followed, with time to see the airport infrastructure and take in a quick cold drink very welcome as the day was proving to be incredibly warm.
- 14. A visit to Café Britannia at the Britannia Barracks on Mousehold Heath proved popular, with the Oberbürgermeister taking particular interest in the rehabilitation concept of the enterprise as well as the lasagne.
- 15. A visit to the Forum on Millennium Plain followed, with a guided tour of the premises including the library.
- 16. A final visit took place which was to the Guildhall on Guildhall Walk. A full tour was given which included a visit to the courtrooms as well as the cells beneath the building. The party was joined by Waltraud and Richard Jarrold.
- 17. The civic party then bade their farewells and were taken to visit Wroxham and Great Yarmouth by Günter Hahn who knows the area very well.

Conclusion

- 18. All in all, the party from Koblenz seemed to greatly enjoy their visit to the twin city, with the Oberbürgermeister particularly noticing many similarities between Koblenz and Norwich.
