1. Appointment of chair

Three nominations for the chair were received for Councillors Fullman, Raby and Schmierer.

RESOLVED to appoint Councillor Schmierer as chair for the ensuing civic year

2. Appointment of vice chair

RESOLVED to appoint Councillor Fullman as vice chair for the ensuing civic year

3. Public questions/petitions

There were no public questions or petitions.

4. Declarations of interest

Councillor Brociek-Coulton declared an other interest in item 6 (below) as she was a member of the Friends of Norwich in Bloom.

Councillor Fullman declared that he was a member of the Norfolk and Norwich / Rouen Friendship Association, the Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association and the Norfolk and Norwich/Koblenz Friendship Association.

Councillor Lubbock declared that she was a member of the Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association and the Norfolk and Norwich/Koblenz Friendship Association.

Councillor Raby declared that he was a member of the Norfolk and Norwich El Viejo Friendship Link and the Norfolk and Norwich / Rouen Friendship Association.

Councillor Vivien Thomas declared that she was a trustee of the Norfolk and Norwich El Viejo Friendship Link.

5. Minutes

RESOLVED to agree the accuracy of the minutes of the meeting held on 15 March 2018

6. Norwich in Bloom – Proposal for a Twinning Garden in Norwich

(Councillor Brociek-Coulton had declared an other interest in this item)

The chair invited Beryl Blower to give a presentation to the committee on the possible installation of a twinning garden.

Beryl Blower said that in 2016, she had been looking for a site to set up a twinning garden and identified the All Saints church on Westlegate as a suitable site. A grant was given by the Royal Horticultural Society to purchase plants for the garden and the theme was agreed to be 'the medieval church' which mirrored a twinning garden installed in Koblenz. The proposal was subject to planning permission.

A gothic window structure would be included in the garden design which would echo those in the All Saints church. Herbaceous planting would be extended to the surrounding areas within the churchyard.

The churchyard had disabled access and would also be visible from Westlegate. There was already a bench in the churchyard but another would be installed. The gate to the churchyard would be locked at night.

Funding was being sought from the Geoffrey Watling Trust and a response was awaited from John Lewis to secure funds for a ramp into the churchyard.

She was asking for the twinning committee to be involved in planning the garden and suggested that it would be nice to have national or local flowers from each of the twinned cities being included in the design of the garden.

The chair commented that older residents from the Ber Street area needed somewhere to break their journey into the city so an additional bench in All Saints church would be welcome.

In response to a member's question, Beryl Blower said that hopefully a plaque would be included on the existing sign in the churchyard describing the gardens. She would also like some of the smaller windows in the display to be pertinent to the twinned cities but had to be respectful of the churchyard area. Waltraud Jarrold said that she was pleased that the idea of a twinning garden was being continued after the success of a similar garden in Koblenz. She offered to raise the issue with the John Jarrold Trust for potential further funding.

Members discussed the possibility of including flowers that were significant to each of the twinned cities and the need to ensure that plants chosen were suitable for the climate.

RESOLVED to:

- (1) thank Beryl Blower for her presentation on the possibility of a twinning garden in the All Saints Church on Westlegate; and
- (2) ask twinning committee members to send information to Beryl Blower on local or national flowers of each of the twinned cities.

7. Reports of the Twinning Associations

Norfolk and Norwich/Rouen Friendship Association

Chris Rowe presented the report. He said that the City of Ale celebrations included whiskey and beers produced at the Northmaen brewery in Rouen. The Rouen brewers would be attending the 2019 City of Ale celebrations and would be sailing to the festival on a schooner to moor at Riverside.

The 60th anniversary would be in 2019 and he would be visiting Rouen for this event. He hoped that there would also be a civic presence for this visit and an invitation would be extended to the Lord Mayor.

Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association

Peter Beckley MBE presented the report. He said that it was a very busy time with follow up work from the civic trip to Novi Sad. An invitation had been extended to the Mayor of Novi Sad to visit Norwich to see how problems were solved here. There had been some visa issues with the visit but he was hopeful that this would be resolved and the visit would take place in October.

Norfolk and Norwich/Koblenz Friendship Association

Waltraud Jarrold updated the committee on the activities of the Norfolk and Norwich/Koblenz Friendship Association. Forty years of twinning had been celebrated and some work would possibly be taking place with the Sainsbury's centre to mark the occasion. The association would be the host for Triorca orchestra this year and grants were being sought for accommodation.

She highlighted the sponsored cycle ride from Koblenz to Norwich taking place in August and said that Koblenz would be accommodating the group in a city hotel.

The German conversation group was going well

Norfolk and Norwich – El Viejo Friendship Link

Ralph Gayton presented the report. He said that there had been violence in Nicaragua and that he had not heard from the local representative since the violence began, despite repeated communications. He would continue trying to make contact and would report back at the next meeting.

Peter Beckley MBE thanked Ralph for the report and said that the work of the twinning associations transcended politics, but it was important to be aware of these complex situations.

The twinning committee expressed their concern for the local contact in El Viejo and welcomed an update on the situation at the next meeting.

RESOLVED to receive the reports from the twinning associations.

8. Twinning committee budget

The democratic and elections manager presented the report. He said that there had been no expenditure so far this year. He reminded the committee to fully complete applications for grants and send these through to the democratic services team. He suggested that any grant applications received between meetings should be agreed by the chair and vice chair.

RESOLVED to:

- (1) note the twinning committee budget report; and
- (2) agree that any applications for grants received between meetings of the twinning committee would be delegated to the democratic and elections manager in consultation with the chair and vice chair.

9. Annual grants for the twinning associations

The democratic and elections manager presented the report.

RESOLVED to approve the annual grants of £200 to each of the associations.

10. Application for grant – Paul Cross Memorial Concert

Wendy Quinn presented the application. She said that the Paul Cross Memorial concert was a great event to raise public awareness of twinning. The funding would be spent on advertising and covering other costs.

RESOLVED to grant £250 to the Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association for the Paul Cross Memorial Concert.

11. Application for grant – Triorca

Peter Beckley MBE presented the application. He said that the Triorca Trust was formed to manage the finances for the orchestra and was headed by three directors.

The democratic and elections manager informed the committee that the application received was incomplete and that the senior committee officer had asked the Triorca Trust for additional information.

RESOLVED to note that an application for a grant had been received from the Triorca Trust and the completed application would be circulated to the chair and vice chair for agreement once received.

THE TRIORCA EUROPEAN YOUTH ORCHESTRA.

The visit to Norwich of the Triorca European Youth Orchestra can only be considered as a fantastic success!

Sixty-seven young performers from the three centres of Novi Sad, Koblenz, and Norwich spent a busy week rehearsing and playing together. Many friendships were renewed and many more begun in an atmosphere of International co-operation that is very rare at this time when there is very little financial support from authorities. It is probably the only local organisation at the moment that fosters European pupil exchange. The importance of sponsorship and grants has never been greater and a donation from the Norfolk & Norwich Novi Sad Association (The Paddy Goldring Fund) enabled the Serbian contingent to make a significant contribution to their share of the costs.

Invitations to receptions at City Hall and County Hall provided an opportunity for some of the youngsters to demonstrate their musical skills and for everyone to meet

The support of 'OPEN' at Bank Plain was nothing short of incredible as they acted as 'hosts' to the orchestra providing a space for everyone to congregate, eat, and rehearse. The youngsters were able to recognise this as their 'base' and, being so central in

Norwich, provided ample opportunity to look round the City with the Norwich youngsters acting as 'guides'. Page 11 of 30 The Tutors and other professionals worked wonders in a short space of time honing and polishing performances - building on weeks of preparation by the 'home teams'.

One of the 'highlights' of the visit was a visit to the 'Proms' at the Royal Albert Hall. The coach driver had time to divert and provide a short tour of London's famous streets and buildings. The whole event proved to be of such success that the Serbian contingent remarked that their lives are now divided into the "period before the Promenade Concert at the Royal Albert Hall and the period after!"

The concerts were considered to be 'mind-blowing' by many of the participating youngsters. The concert at OPEN in Norwich on the evening of the penultimate day was considered by many to be the best performance by an orchestra at that venue and was of a quality that is expected of visiting professional orchestras to the City.

The final day and the visit to Saffron Hall at Saffron Walden proved to be quite an adventure. The coach that was taking all the orchestra and tutors to the venue from Norwich caught fire on the way!

Once the orchestra, their instruments and their luggage were safely on the bank of the A11 we get the impression that the young people thought it was great fun and a sort of 'entertainment' laid on for their benefit! We understand it was 'all smoke' and no conflagration.

As far as the organisers were concerned the delay in getting a substitute coach (which was smaller and had to 'shuttle' backwards and forwards in to collect two batches of performers) meant hours of delay and a complete rescheduling of rehearsals as well as finding time to feed everyone and get them composed before the performance. The sheer professionalism of all involved provided a concert of exceptional quality which is probably best summed up in the following observation by our Hon. Vice President Paul King and his wife Hester:

"….We were simply bowled over by the concert and the tremendous talent of the Triorca European Youth Orchestra.

Julia Hwang gave a stunning performance and it is hard to believe she is only 22.

The Tchaikovsky Symphony No. 5 was played as well as we have ever heard it. Nicholas Daniel was such an enthusiastic and outstanding conductor.

How marvellous it must be for these young people to get together for a week and, in such a short time, to achieve the standards of any one of the great Symphony Orchestras. The final work was a tour-de-force...."



2018 Summer Outing – Waveney River Cruise

This was a truly memorable weekend and we are grateful to the Oberbürgermeister and the City of Koblenz for their amazing generosity and to Brigitte Finkemeier for all the time preparing and making sure that it ran smoothly.

The NNKFA Summer Outing 23 June NNKFA outing to Woburn Abbey a personal view.

There is a saying in Germany that "When the angels travel the sun travels with them" and so it was when our group of 48 left County Hall to head for Woburn Abbey on 23rd June. Secure in the knowledge that we were in the safe hands of our usual driver Mark we settled down for our 2 hour journey to the Palladian manor house and gardens.

We made good time and by 11am our Woburn host Lisa was welcoming us to the Abbey and gardens. When organising our outing Sandra and John Sheppard had realised that there was also a garden show in the grounds of the Abbey and so we were lucky to have an added attraction. Indeed not only were there a number of stands to explore but we had access to other parts of the estate not usually open to the public including the Sculpture gallery and the Duke and Duchess's private garden.



So after a cup of coffee in the Sculpture gallery we headed for the private gardens and the camellia house which was home to one of the most enormous bananas plants I have seen along with other impressive palms and succulents.

Walking out towards the garden show we saw a number of people sitting on large bean bags under a magnificent Cedar of Lebanon. Such a thoughtful touch I felt providing an opportunity for families to relax under the cool shade of this magnificent tree. A tour around the stands in the garden show left us with a number of decisions to make about which plants to take home given the constraints of the coach and just how many more plants we can squeeze into our garden. The choice was huge so we took the opportunity to think about it while



sitting and listening to the music of the Bedford Town band who entertained us with music ranging from John Rutter to Oklahoma.

And so onto the house which has been in the ownership of the Dukes of Bedford since the time of the

reformation when it was given to the family by Henry VIII. An exhibition on Humphry Repton helped us understand the way the estate has developed as did an exhibition curated by years 3 and 4 of the local school. The students had used objects from the Duke's collection to describe how the estate has changed over the centuries. Still used as a family home Woburn Abbey houses a number of collections from silver toasters (I've never seen so many different styles of toaster!) to priceless works of arts - the largest collection in private ownership. We spent some time wandering through the ornate rooms admiring the Canaletto, Velasquez and Rembrandts. While in the house we were offered the chance to hear a talk about the "Flying Duch-

ess" and her husband the 11th Duke. The couple were great philanthropists. Examples of their generosity included building a hospital with free access and supporting the families of the soldiers who had enlisted in the Duke's Bedfordshire battalion. Indeed during WW1 the entire house was given over to the government for use by military staff. One of the rooms we saw had small holes in the Beautiful hand painted wallpaper where, we were told, the Wrens, who used the room for relaxation, had placed their dart board.

The Duchess had a range of interests including martial arts, nursing and flying. She and husband worked hard on the estate both for and with its workers and tenants until she sadly disappeared on a solo flight she was piloting to visit a friend in Norfolk. Her husband never recovered from this loss and after he died the house fell into decline. However it has since been carefully restored and is

the home of the current Duke and Duchess. Alongside the splendour of the house it was good to see family photographs.

Leaving the house we had just enough time for a cream tea and, have a final look at the gardens and buy our plants before making our way back to the coach for our journey home. Safely back at County Hall we thanked Mark and Sandra and John for such an enjoyable day said farewell to our fellow travellers and set off for home with the sun still shining.

Triorca

- 1. Members were advised that the Triorca Trust would be making an application for funding at the last meeting of the twinning committee.
- 2. The Triorca Trust is a registered charity which was established to provide opportunities for young, gifted musicians from three European countries to perform together and receive tuition from recognised international tutors and performers. This provides the opportunity for the development of international understanding between the young people involved. The trust's objective is to provide the relief of financial hardship amongst young musicians particularly those selected to play with the international youth orchestra, Triorca, comprising young people from Norwich and Norfolk, Novi Sad and the Vojodina (Serbia) and Koblenz and Rheinland-Pfalz (Germany).
- 3. The trust has close relationships with the Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association and the Norfolk and Norwich Koblenz Friendship Association and their twin associations in Novi Sad and Koblenz.
- 4. The Triorca hosted an international concert at Open on 27 July 2018 and a dress rehearsal at City Hall earlier in the week. The orchestra also held a concert in Essex on 28 July. The last concert of this type was held in Norwich in 2014 and Germany in 2016.
- 5. The application was received after the date of the last twinning committee and as agreed at the last meeting, the democratic and elections manager consulted with Councillor Schmierer (Lord Mayor and chair of the twinning committee) and Councillor Fullman (vice chair). The application is attached to this report as appendix A. Consideration was given to the request and it was decided to grant the request for £500 to pay for refreshments at the rehearsal session (hosted at City Hall) and the concert at Open.

60th Anniversary of the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association

- 6. An application has been received from the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association for £250 as a contribution to the costs of bus hire and the coach driver's expenses for the associations visit to Rouen, 7 to 11 June 2019, as part of the association's celebrations to mark its 60th anniversary and to "perpetuate twinning links with Rouen.
- 7. The hire cost of the coach is £4,000. The grant of £250 is requested to cover the driver's expenses. Members of the association are expected to pay for their own travel costs. Assuming that 40 seats of the bus were filled this would mean that members are paying around £100 for their travel costs. The grant would assist with the financial burden if the association failed to fill all the seats. The applicant also states that a high proportion of the members travelling to Rouen live within the Norwich City Council boundaries (75 per cent).

- 8. As the 60th anniversary approaches, members of the association are considering other activities and events in Norwich to mark the event. An initial approach has been made to the council's civic office regarding the Lord Mayor's availability around Mayor Making in July 2019 and it is therefore likely that the association will make further requests for funding in the near future.
- 9. Members should also be aware that any visit and associated costs from potential visits by the Lord Mayor and consort would be funded from the twinning fund.


