Brenda is typical of a housewife whose life is being transformed by the new modern gadgets in her home, bright new colourful home designs, wallpaper, paints, furniture, household products and instant foods. However she was a regular visitor to Alf's store as a little girl with her mother and remembers his kindness etc (Can see both sides of the argument- sits on the fence.)
