Report

Background

- 1. Section 115E of the Highways Act 1980 (The Act) provides for a council to grant a person permission to use objects or structures on certain categories of highway for a purpose which will result in the production of income.
- 2. The Act also provides for a council to attach such conditions as they think fit to a permission granted under Section 115E. The council has adopted standard conditions in respect of permissions to use objects or structures on the highway and these are attached as appendix A to the report.
- 3. The Act gives councils a wide discretion to determine such applications and to impose conditions. Each case must be considered on its own merits with due weight being given to relevant considerations only. Existing policies or guidelines should not be applied so rigidly that an exercise of discretion in each individual case is precluded. Accordingly, the adopted standard conditions could be added to or amended depending on the circumstances of each individual application.

The application

- 4. An application has been submitted in respect of Ivy Collection, 30 London Street & 13 Castle Meadow Norwich NR2 1LD seeking to place 5 tables and 10 chairs on the highway between the hours of 08:00 and 00:30 Monday to Sunday.
- 5. A copy of the application, accompanying photographs and location plans are attached at appendix B to the report.

Consultation

- 6. In accordance with The Act, occupiers of nearby premises have been consulted and appropriate notices have been placed on the street. Notification of the application has also been given to Chatterbox (the talking newspaper for the visually impaired) and the Norwich Access Group.
- 7. Details of the application have also been forwarded to the Norfolk Constabulary, Norfolk Fire Service and the City Council's Planning, Transportation and Landscape, Health and Safety and Pollution Control sections for comment.

Comments / objections / support

- 8. Representations have been received in respect of the application from the following and are attached at appendix C to the report:
 - One local resident
 - the Norfolk Constabulary Licensing Team (agreement has been made to amended the hours from 08:00 to 23:00 Monday to Sunday)

Tables and Chairs Licence – Standard Conditions

- 1 The Council's reasonable expenses in connection with the granting of this permission shall have been paid and the annual fee starting with the date of this permission shall have been paid before the permission is first exercised.
- 2 The Licensee shall indemnify the Council against any claim whatsoever, in respect of injury, damage or loss arising out of the grant of this permission other than injury, damage or loss which is attributable to the negligence of the Council.
- 3 The objects or structures shall be placed only on the licensed area and on no other part of the public highway.
- 4 The objects or structures shall be used only for the purposes stated above and only in connection with the premises.
- 5 The objects or structures shall be removed from the public highway forthwith upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden.
- 6 The objects or structures shall be removed from the public highway forthwith to enable the passage of any emergency service vehicles or any vehicle engaged on the repair or maintenance of the public highway or apparatus within the public highway or any other vehicle authorised by the Council to proceed on the public highway.
- 7 Permission for the tables and chairs is granted from (time of day/month of year) to (time of day/month of year) (subject to earlier termination under clause 13).
- 8 No amplified music or live music shall take place on the licensed area.
- 9 The tables and chairs, the subject of this Licence, shall be removed from the licensed area each day outside of the licence period.
- 10 The Licensee shall ensure that the licensed area is mainly enclosed by a barrier that is in keeping with the visual appearance of the area, not less than 800mm high and with no more than 150mm between the base rail and the ground, or other design as previously agreed in writing by the Council. Neither the barrier nor other furniture should carry strident advertising that goes beyond the purpose of discreetly identifying that the pavement cafe is associated with a particular business.
- 11 The Licensee undertakes to ensure that the licensed area is closely monitored and kept clean and tidy at all times.

- 12 No alteration to the highway surface shall be permitted to be carried out by the Licensee in implementing this Licence
- 13 The Council may, by service of a notice in writing on the Licensee or owner of the premises, withdraw the Licence forthwith:-

(a) in an emergency or in the event that the Council considers the exercise of the Licence causes a substantial and unreasonable obstruction of the right of the public to pass or re-pass on the public highway,

(b) if any condition of this permission is broken,

(c) if the Council considers it to be necessary in connection with the exercise of any of its functions or the functions of any statutory undertaker or public utility,

- (d) for any other reasonable cause.
- 14 The Licensee shall inform the Council's Head of Citywide Services in writing of any change in the owner or occupier of the premises within one month of that change.
- 15 This permission is for tables and chairs and barriers only. No other items, for example space heaters, are permitted by this licence.

To whom it may concern,

I am writing in regards to application 18/00541/TABCHA from Ivy Collection, 30 London Street, to place 5 sets of tables and chairs outside at the bottom of London Street, that could effectively effect my trade. First of all, I thank you for the letters stating the planned proposal as quite rightly it does have the potential to effect my business and all in the surrounding area of Swan Lane. I regret to inform that I strongly oppose this idea for numerous reasons.

The first being, as part of the public highways and how busy our lanes are, I think it has potential to be a very dangerous idea. Having worked in Swan Lane for over 4 years, I see daily the footfall and number of pedestrians that pass us, not forgetting automated vehicles including disability vehicles, and the Bicycles, Skateboards, Scooters that come past : most often very fast and not showing any consideration for other members of the public: let alone business users. Having Waiters and customers manouvering around tables and chairs outside in a packed area already, I think has the potential to be very hazardous.

I cannot stress how much rubbish and waste we already encounter from some of the surrounding Food outlets: mainly late night Bars and establishments. Not so much general waste but more anti-social behaviour caused by intoxication. I personally have removed Urine, Faeces, Drug Paraphanelia and more commonly Vomit, from outside my store and it is almost daily. This is not my concern from this establishment as I am sure it is an up market venue, of course I am not familiar with the chain but it does not present itself as a late night Bar that would bring more anti-social behaviour to our lanes. My concern being more revenue and leaving businesses such as myself and the Jewellers surrounding, to clean up after revellers. There is a street cleaner most days, I have not encountered weekend shifts, but they only remove litter and items such as that, that can be placed into their carts and removed. The vomit, glasses or bottles, urine etc: that is left behind for us businesses that are unfortunate enough to have open shopfronts and doorways. As my building as I am sure most are around the lanes, is a listed building, I cannot put a hand rail up for health and safety let alone shutters or railings to stop anyone from accessing my shop after I close and causing such disturbances. This is a major inconvenience and one which I have co-ordinated with the local Police department, and still do keep up to date with.

Secondly after being a hazard to pedestrians, is the blatant lack of regard to businesses that are already in exinstence in London Street but mostly Swan Lane as that's where this seating area would effect most. Everyone occuping Swan Lane including Dipples the Jewellers, Fourth Avenue, Bullens the Jewellers,

Logans Café etc : all very high footfall stores that bring generous business to Norwich city centre and this end of town. As far as I can remember, all occupants of Swan Lane were allowed to advertise their businesses with A Frames, 1 outside of their store but more importantly 1 at the end of Swan Lane in the main square, near the seating area as well. We were told in 2017 to remove these immediately as they were a hazard to people with either visual impairments or disability vehicles. After years of advertising and this being a crucial part of our footfall and sales, this was particularly disheartening. Of course I understand that persons with visual impairments may not be able to see such boards, but all of our shops never positioned them in such a way that they would be a hazard to anyone.

This regulation by yourselves, came almost immediately (within days) of a member of the public coming into my store and several others, shouting and being abusive that we were causing a hazard to others: which wasn't the case. We have since been penalised and forced to remove our advertising boards and only having one outside attached to our shop fronts. At which point, there are no directions or sign posts, no advertising and no maps to point any consumers down our lane and help those that use our services, to locate us. As businesses that pay such high rent and tax and licenses and fees, and generate a huge amount of trade annually to the city centre, it wouldn't be entirey inappropriate to ask for sign posts (much like street signs) that include all of our business names that you cannot see directly from the highway.

I think it is unreasonable to enforce a regulation to existing businesses, and now enforce a new one entirely for such items that could still potentially be a hazard for pedestrians and even more so with tables and chairs and customers exiting tables: pushchairs or wheelchairs perhaps too. I welcome any new business and wish them the best of luck with trade in our community, but I think this is most unfair to us exisiting as well as it being very hazardous. I know at the end of 2017 into 2018, the council wanted to enforce a regulation that would mean all Bicycles and Scooters wouldn't be ride between certain peak hours of the day for safety and would be pushed through town to avoid incidents, but I can 100% ensure that that hasn't happened even once. Some of the Bikes and Scooters that pass our stores are so fast and could easily cause serious injury to others, let alone motorised Scooters.

It does irridicate one aspect of the area which is positive and that is the noise pollution caused by street performers and the inconvenience they sometimes cause by making very loud, brash "music". My Podiatry services offer private health care sessions, it is a high standard we try to maintain much like Jewellers that surround my store, all of which promote very exclusive products and attract a certain clientel. I hope the council and commity take my counter argument seriously as it does pose as inconvenient to the hundreds of passers by that use the walkways daily. I would hate any incidents to occur as the paths are too narrow or even staff at the restaurant to be knocked over etc. If you have further comments or questions please do not hesitate to contact myself on the lines below.
