Report

Background

- 1. At its meeting on 17 November 2017 the Mousehold Conservators approved a revised timescale for the production of the draft management plan.
- 2. It was agreed a draft of the second four objectives of part two of the plan, management prescriptions, project prescription and 10 year work programme would be brought to the 15 June 2018 meeting for consideration and comments.

Progress to date

3. The second four objectives for part two of the have been produced along with management prescriptions (Appendix A), project specifications (Appendix B) relevant project maps (to be displayed electronically at the meeting) and a 10 year work programme (Appendix C).

Next steps

- 4. The information in Appendices A, B and C to be reviewed by the Conservators for approval and any additions or amends to be provided to the Parks and open spaces manager to enable the plan to be revised accordingly.
- 5. The document will then be passed to the communications team for a draft document to be produced for public consultation.
- 6. When the first management plan for Mousehold Heath was produced, consultation was carried out at a public meeting and also a local drop in session near to the heath.
- 7. As this is a revision of the previous plan and due to the amount of resources required to hold these types of events, relative to the feedback received, it is proposed that this form of consultation is not used on this occasion.
- 8. It is proposed that consultation for this plan is carried out online via Survey Monkey for the general public and direct with key stakeholder organisations.

1.A VISION FOR MOUSEHOLD HEATH

'The Mousehold Conservators are committed to safeguarding the long term future of Mousehold Heath as a high quality and accessible natural area for residents and visitors to the city to enjoy.

To manage the heath in a way that protects and enhances the valuable historic and natural features of the site, and provides opportunities for all to be involved in looking after and learning about the site.'

The vision will be achieved through the following objectives, management prescriptions and projects.

Project detail is contained in the Mousehold Heath project register.

2.MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES

There are eight management objectives.

- A) To ensure Mousehold Heath is a welcoming place for people to visit.
- B) To protect Mousehold Heath and ensure that it is a safe and secure place to visit.
- C) To ensure that Mousehold Heath is clean and well maintained.
- D) To manage Mousehold Heath in a way that has a positive impact on the environment.
- E) To improve habitats and the natural environment for wildlife, to enhance the biodiversity of Mousehold Heath.
- F) To safeguard the historic landscape, archaeological features and buildings of Mousehold Heath.
- G) To provide opportunities local communities to be involved in in all aspect of our work.
- H) To promote Mousehold Heath to increase awareness, knowledge, understanding and sense of pride of Mousehold Heath

E To improve habitats and the natural environment for wildlife, to enhance the biodiversity of Mousehold Heath.

Woodland

Although formerly a large area of heathland Mousehold is now predominantly a secondary woodland habitat. A large amount of the woodland is managed with minimum intervention and natural processes allowed to occur.

A programme of coppicing and felling is used to maintain a diversity of age range and structure in the woodland.

Glade and ride areas are created and maintained linking together areas to further increase diversity within the woodland.

Coppicing is used to create pockets of a more diverse age range within the woodland and also adjacent to path, ride and glade edges to create a transitionary habitat between the open areas and woodland.

Dead and decaying standing deadwood will be retained fallen and pieces will be left as large as possible at their original location.

Grassland and heathland

The majority of the heathland and flower rich meadows have been lost over time. The remaining areas of heathland and acid grassland are vulnerable to being lost too through the encroachment of trees and shrubs.

Existing areas of acid grassland will be cut and the arisings removed and work carried out to remove trees and shrubs from remnant acid grassland to increase the coverage of the grassland.

The areas of existing heathland will be maintained by removing bracken and any encroaching shrubs or saplings. Gorse will be managed in some cases removing it and in others managing it through rotational cutting.

Though the priority remains to maintain the areas of existing heathland and those restored over the life of the last plan, new areas will be created, subject to the resources being available to do this and also maintain what is created. To do this and shrubs will be removed to allow light into the area and then the surface layer of humus stripped, to deplete the nutrient resources and to stimulate the dormant heather seed bank to germinate.

Ponds

The ponds on the heath will be managed to improve biodiversity whenever possible, removing vegetation from within and around them, when necessary and in accordance with industry best practice.

Invasive undesirable species

Invasive and undesirable species will be removed based on an assessment of the threat they pose to a particular habitat.

Where a particular problem is identified the species will be removed by cutting, applying selective herbicide, cutting and pulling.

Recording and monitoring

Information will be collected through a range of different methods about species and habitats to enable the impact of the different management regimes on the site to be measured in terms of effectiveness. This information will also inform on going decision making and guide the development of projects in the future.

Earthworks and archaeological features

Earthworks and historical features are vulnerable to encroachment by vegetation and compaction and erosion from visitors walking and cycling on the site. The features will be maintained by management through the cutting and removal of vegetation, shrubs and trees, using methods sympathetic to the sensitivities of the feature.

Information and interpretation

The provision of information and interpretation on the site is crucial for people to understand what is allowed and not allowed on the heath as well as teaching them about the natural and historical importance of the site; so that they not only respect the site but also value it more and have a more rewarding visit.

Education

Young people are the next generation who will have a role to play in the future, in terms of using the heath and looking after and protecting it. Their understanding of the historical importance of the heath and the habitats and species it contains is crucial. Work will continue and be developed further relating to providing educational activities and visits on site and in local schools.

Events

The heath provides an excellent venue for events for local people and is inline with the reason the Act gave the heath for the citizens of Norwich to enjoy. Work will continue to provide a range of onsite events, delivered to increase people's understanding or enjoyment of the heath, alongside working with the Norwich City Council's Events team to deliver other future events appropriate to the site.

Media

It is important that the profile of the heath is maintained in the city as a unique and valuable open space. This will be done working in conjunction with the local press, to and radio wherever possible to keep to maintain the heath and the work of the Conservators in a positive light.

The website and social media are also equally important in terms of raising the profile of the heath and the work. The web pages will be reviewed and developed and publically accessible GIS data to improve peoples understanding of the heath will be developed also.

To improve public access by removing vegetation including bramble, scrub and sapling growth impeding pathway access for the visiting public including all four corner marker stones, banks and ditches of the inner and outer mounds for improving interpretation of the site.

All scrub including brambles and saplings should be cut on a regular basis to prevent them spreading and causing root damage.

Saplings and scrub should be cut as close to the ground surface as

Possible, with roots and stumps left in-situ and treated to prevent regrowth.

Trees

Established trees growing on the site of the chapel building/buildings

will be retained, selected trees will be removed with roots left *in-situ* and treated preventing regrowth. Any ivy growing on the trees will be monitored. Where necessary, ivy will be cut back to restrict growth and to prevent trees collapsing under its weight. Ivy should be cut as close to the ground surface as possible, with roots left *in-situ* and treated to prevent regrowth.


Selected trees growing on key sight lines from the interpretation panel will be removed along with overhanging branches. Roots left *in-situ* and treated to prevent regrowth, ref fig 2.

Cut vegetation including brash and cut timber can be taken off site and burnt in adjacent woodland.

Piles of cut timber and branches can be left in selected locations to serve as invertebrate habitats or used to close minor paths for protection against erosion.



SPECIFICATION TO ACHIEVE THE AIMS

Cleaning

The Contractor shall clean all parts of the areas of each shelter/bandstand including all the following items once a week from the 1st April to the 30th September and once a month October to March.

All floor areas, seating and steps shall be swept and any stains, deposits etc. removed and spot cleaned with water and/or disinfectant as appropriate.

Check for graffiti and remove/cover areas up to .5sq.m of obscene and homophobic. Larger areas of obscene and homophobic graffiti to be reported to Supervising Officer immediately or as soon as practically possible all other graffiti to be reported on inspection report.

The Contractor shall undertake additional cleaning in April and September:


All painted and stained surfaces shall be wiped clean and left in a dry condition, taking care not to damage paintwork or other finished surfaces.

Roof rafters, ledges, partition tops, balustrading and painted surfaces shall be washed down and rinsed to remove all deposits of dirt, dust and cleaning streaks.

When the need arises, due to heavy soiling, the routine cleaning process should include either the use of disinfectant or the use of a steam cleaner, but only on surfaces that will not be damaged by steam cleaning.


