Background

- 1. Parking enforcement is a function that Norwich City Council carries out on behalf of Norfolk County Council.
- 2. We currently have a contract with ICES Limited (Imperial civil enforcement solutions) as the supplier of Parking 3Sixty software and associated items which expires at the end of July 2020.
- 3. This software is used by Parking Operations and the Civil Enforcement Officers for the enforcement of parking policy in the city. This includes licences for the equipment used by the CEOs as part of their patrols, the system that generates the penalty charge notices (PCNs) and also the online payment/dispute process for the notices.
- 4. A new agreement is required to continue to be able to enforce parking policy in the city.

Tender process

- 5. The expiry of the current contract requires a new procurement.
- 6. Frameworks have been identified with both Crown Commercial Services (CSS) and G Cloud which will allow a direct award for this software and associated items.

Timescales

7. Delegated authority will allow the new procurement to progress to replace the current contract which is due to expire at the end of July 2020.
