Purpose:

To provide a financial update to the twinning committee.

Recommendation:

To:

- 1) note the twinning fund financial position; and
- 2) consider a twinning grant application from the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association.

Policy Framework

The Council has five corporate priorities, which are:

- People live independently and well in a diverse and safe city.
- Norwich is a sustainable and healthy city.
- Norwich has the infrastructure and housing it needs to be a successful city.
- The city has an inclusive economy in which residents have equal opportunity to flourish.
- Norwich City Council is in good shape to serve the city.

This report helps to meet the corporate priorities of Norwich City Council is in good shape to serve the city and people live independently and well in a diverse and safe city.

Report

- 1. The balance of the Twinning Fund on 14 March will be £5,065.97
- 2. This includes the council's annual twinning contribution of £2,060 for the current financial year.
- 3. The Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association have received a grant of £400 for the annual Paul Cross Memorial Concert.
- 4. The committee have also agreed, in principle to recommend to the Interim Chief Finance Officer (Section 151 Officer), the annual grant of £200 to each of the following twinning association:
 - a. Norfolk and Norwich Koblenz Friendship Association
 - b. Norfolk and Norwich Novi Sad Association
 - c. Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association
- 5. A grant application has also been received from the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association for £1280, to help with the costs of the football tournament that will be hosted by the Cringleford Junior Football Club. The committee will need to consider whether to recommend this to the Interim Chief Finance Officer (Section 151 Officer) for approval.
- 6. The twinning associations are encouraged to submit applications to the committee for consideration for any events planned.
- 7. Members of the committee are reminded that grant applications from twinning associations are made by completing a grant application form which is sent to democratic services. Any applications are then considered by the twinning committee. The committee will recommend any agreed grants to the Interim Chief Finance Officer (Section 151 Officer) for approval.
- 8. At its meeting in October 2022, the twinning committee recommended using the twinning fund to purchase new twinning boards to be displayed in the civic corridor at City Hall. The cost for 5 new boards was estimated at £150 and these costs have been approved. Democratic services encourages the associations to bring forward their wording and artwork. We will start the work removing the old boards shortly.
- 9. The friendship link between Norwich and Uru-Eu-Wau Wau indigenous people based in Rondônia, Brazil has been established. The agreement was signed by the Lord Mayor and an appropriate location for this to be hung is being sought.
- 10. The council has been in contact with the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association about a football tournament including clubs from Rouen and Norfolk. The event is being held at Easton College. The association is very welcome to make a grant application to the committee to help support the event.

2. Please describe fully why you are applying for a grant and which city or town you are forming links with?

A very special International Youth Football Tournament 3rd & 4th August 2024 will be taking place organised by Cringleford Junior Football Club involving teams from Rouen and Koblenz, and taking place in Easton. The Norfolk & Norwich Rouen Friendship Association are involved as we want to promote links between Norwich and Rouen, and this event a wonderful chance to start links, and could lead to even more. How can Norwich help with this event which will open many opportunities for Twinning with Rouen and Normandy? I do understand the financial difficulties that all local governments are having, but I hope that Norwich could make a generous financial contribution to this very special event using the Twinning fund. With Rouen still being very keen to be very international after their failed bid to be European City of Culture 2028 it would be great to have a senior officer and Cabinet member to liaise directly with, especially as Rouen Metropole wants to continue to develop the connection.

Cringleford JFC are forecast to lose money from the tournament given the costs involved. While the tournament is not designed to be a money raiser (as the focus is on bringing teams together), they are struggling. On top of the costs of the pitch hire, car park hire, refs, St John's Ambulance, FA sanctioning, trophies, etc., (which they are hoping to recoup through entry fees from the UK teams plus some sponsorship), they are currently funding the entries for the Rouen and Koblenz teams (£95 per team), and the cost of the evening community party for the kids (£7.50 per player). Rouen - The Rouen Metropole / Council confirmed that 4 Rouen teams will be entering across the U11, U12 and U13 age groups. They are funding the transport and most of

the accommodation. Cringleford are funding the team entries plus the remaining accommodation costs. Rouen are focusing on teams with players from disadvantaged backgrounds and are also supporting the administrative side (e.g. arranging passports for the players).

How this will further the aims of the Twinning Committee:

- 1) promote and foster Civic links and exchange activities of all kinds with Rouen,
- Obviously this promotes and fosters links with Rouen, and has already assisted us make excellent links with various officers at Rouen City Hall!
- 2) The policy of the Committee is to concentrate on making grants to assist visits by young people this certainly will assist visits by young people.
- 3) an initial visit to set up a new link This will set up a new link aiming to make the connection long lasting and far reaching to the benefit of young people in Norwich and Rouen.
- 4) in cases of particular financial hardship. Rouen are focusing on teams with players from disadvantaged backgrounds
