Twinning Committee Grant Supporting Document

Born 1988, Norwich, UK.

I was born and raised in Norwich and first took up photography while studying my Alevels at City College, Norwich.

After graduating with a BA(Hons) Photography from Nottingham Trent University I returned to Norwich to pursue my photographic career. I worked for a number of local photographers, which gave me a great insight into both the creative and business side of the industry. I subsequently moved to London and have been working as a freelance photographic assistant since 2012

Since moving away from Norwich I have wanted to regain a connection to the city I once called home, to reignite my love for Norwich and gain a new perspective of its culture and history. The idea of this project came about in the hope of reigniting that connection.

Part of Norwich's history is its twinned cities; the aim of twinning cities 'was seen as a way of spreading understanding of different cultures' which I feel is still relevant in today's society, particularly with Brexit looming. I'm looking to produce a less touristic view of the city. I want to delve deeper into Norwich, to offer an insight into areas the viewer may never have seen before and give a new perspective on some of the more traditional. I am interested in exploring the more direct connections Norwich has with its twinned city's along with discovering each city's individual history. I want to uncover local folklore, to find stories from both past and present and what gives each city its sense of place.

My practice predominantly looks at the everyday and overlooked objects, areas which aren't traditionally beautiful and where the urban and natural blend and contrast. My images are structured and composed, I like to play with a sense of scale, to make the ordinary peculiar and de-familiarise the familiar.

I have moved away from the 35mm format for which most of my previous work has been shot, I felt a 6x6 square format lends itself to my style of work while also helping focus the viewers' attention on the subject.

4. Please describe fully why you are applying for a grant and which city or town you are forming links with?

I am applying for the grant to help towards the cost of an exhibition at the Museum of Norwich. The exhibition is to mark the 60^{th} anniversary of Norwich's twinning with Rouen and will showcase my photographs from both Norwich and Rouen. The Exhibition will run from the 25^{th} June $2019 - 5^{th}$ October 2019.

I am forming particular links with Rouen via the exhibition, I am currently in discussion with the Norwich Rouen Club to take the exhibition to Rouen in November 2019 during their annual 'This is England' film festival.

I have however also been in contact with members of the Novi Sad and Koblenz friendship associations as my project is showcasing all of Norwich Twinned Cities. I visited Novi Sad and Koblenz in September 2018 and will be planning further visits to each city as well as El Viejo in 2019/2020.

6. If the grant is for another purpose other than a visit, please provide as much detail as you can by answering the following question.

a) Please describe your project/event/activity and explain how it will further the aims of the twinning committee?

The exhibition is to mark the 60th anniversary of the twinning of Norwich and Rouen.

The exhibition will showcase my photographs taken of my home city of Norwich and of Rouen. I will be travelling back and forth between each city exploring the notion of place and belonging, looking at the urban and man altered landscape. Offering the viewer, a less touristic and unexplored view of each city while giving a fresh perspective on those more traditional. I want to uncover local folklore, to find stories from both past and present and what gives each city its sense of place.

As well as my photographs, the exhibition will also be looking back at Norwich in 1959. This was the year the twinning partnership was formed and will be an opportunity to showcase Norwich in the late 50's which was then undergoing a rapid post-war transformation with the emergence from the gloom of rationing to a forward-looking city which was in the midst of various of building projects. Most significant of these was the complete 'facelift' of Magdalen Street which was launched in May 1959. This was a ground-breaking project between the Civic Trust and the City Council, which resulted in a cohesive aesthetic for the street and attracted national acclaim.

1959 also saw the opening of Anglia Television which shone a spotlight on the city and bought many new creative professionals to Norwich. 1959 was also a highlight year for Norwich City Football club – the Canaries made it to the semi-finals of the F.A cup, an accolade which saw the team being nicknamed 'the 59-ers'.

A small section of the Norwich in 1959, will be collaboratively curated with a group of young people as part of the wider Heritage Lottery Funded project called 'Kick the Dust'. This will open the door to a younger audience to Norwich's Twinned Cities while also giving them the chance to learn more about the cultural, social and political landscape of Norwich in 1959.

Myself and the Museum of Norwich are also in discussion regarding putting on talks and/or workshops about my work which would be on during the exhibition.





Report

Background

- An application for a twinning grant has been received from Stefan Ebelewicz.
 The application form and supporting statement is attached to this report as appendices A and B.
- 2. The total twinning grant is around £2,000 per annum.

Application

- 3. The grant to assist with the cost of an exhibition at the Museum of Norwich at the Bridewell to mark the 60th Anniversary of the twinning between Rouen and Norwich. The exhibition will be held from 25 June to 5 October 2019.
- 4. The applicant has requested £500 and states the funding will be used to frame and mount photographic images for the exhibition.
- The supporting statement provided by the application (Appendix B) sets out the context of the application and detailed costs of the project, which is being funded by a combination of funding from grants and funded by the applicant, himself.

Considerations

- 6. The applicant has costed the entire project at £7,398.53. The budget breakdown is included in the supporting statement and shows costs of visits to Rouen and Norwich, but not including accommodation; costs of film and processing and other materials, and costs of future visits to Rouen and Norwich, and spending money.
- 7. Norwich Museums Service (Museum of Norwich) is funding the project by granting £1,000 to support the wider Norwich 1959 exhibition and is also providing "in kind support" to curate the exhibition to the value of £500.
- 8. The applicant has also made a grant application to the Norfolk Arts Project Fund for a sum of £500. The outcome of this application is not available at the time of writing this report.
- 9. The exhibition will not only highlight the 60th anniversary of the city's twinning friendship links with Rouen but will celebrate the city's culture and history.
- 10. The applicant has liaised with members of the Norfolk and Norwich Rouen Friendship Association and has built up links with the twinning association in Rouen and Norwich. He is currently in discussions to take the exhibition to Rouen in November 2019 to coincide with the annual English speaking film festival 'This is England'.
- 11. This application is for the exhibition at the Museum of Norwich is part of a wider project which incorporates all of the city's twinning friendship links. The applicant has visited Novi Sad and Koblenz in September 2018 and is planning further visits to Rouen and each of these cities and El Viejo in 2019/2020.

Recommendation

- 12. The committee should consider granting the applicant a sum of £500, or an amount to be determined by the committee, to assist with the costs of the exhibition.
- 13. The application fulfils the aims of promoting the cultural and educational benefits of twinning.
