The Committee noted the representations from interested parties.  
There were no representations from responsible authorities  
The Committee noted that many of the objections related to problems already existing in the area.  
The Committee noted the applicant had amended their operating schedule to include;  
The area in front of the shop will to be cleaned of litter at least once a day.  
There will be a CCTV camera placed outside the front of the shop so people coming into the shop will be able to be seen. Film/digital images will be made available to the police/council upon request and images retained for at least 28 days.  
The applicant will adopt a Challenge 21 Policy and keep a refusals book

**Determination –**

**The licence was granted as asked for but with reduced hours for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. These will be;**

**Monday- Saturdays 07:00hrs to 22:00hrs**  
**Sundays 08:00hrs to 22:00hrs**

**The Committee's reasons:**

The Committee noted that the changes to the operating schedule and welcomed these. The Committee felt that the problems of crime and disorder raised by the interested parties were already present in the area but due to the area being mainly residential in nature it was felt that reduced hours for the selling of alcohol for consumption off the premises would be preferable.

**Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority**

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant representation, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
