Report

Review of 2013-14 work programme

- 1. All main objectives set out in the 2013-14 works programme for biodiversity improvements will have been met by the end of the financial year. This will have been accomplished through the installation of a new community wildlife pond and the expansion of open heath land areas within the Higher Level Steward scheme with works being carried out by specialist machinery and volunteer groups.
- 2. Infrastructure improvements were completed notably the removal of old wooden bollards and installation of new hard wood bollards around the Pitch and Putt car park, works also included the re establishment of the soil mound around the rear of the car park improving security and the levelling of the surface providing improved access to visitors and local users alike, this will be carried forward in 2014-15 with improvements to the public car park in front of the pavilion.
- 3. Improvements to the Connect two cycle routes were undertaken by volunteers and the Mousehold wardens who cut back vegetation and branches that were overhanging the cycle way along Gurney Road adjacent to the Ant Hills.
- 4. The guided walk programme was very well attended with full attendance on nearly all public walks. This included surveying of fauna and flora carried out by volunteers which contribute to the understanding of Mousehold and the biodiversity improvements arising from management works. With increase in diversity of species recorded especially species dependant on heath land habitat it can be said with confidence that positive management work is bringing improvements with the Mousehold species list increasing year on year.
- 5. The updating of the orienteering course has not yet been completed due to copyright issues with the maps used. The Mousehold wardens will work with the Norwich Orienteering Club to progress this is 2014-15 with a view to having a downloadable map on the Mousehold page of the council's website for public use in 2014-15.

Proposed work programme 2014-15

- 6. The Conservators has in more recent years, approved the annual work programme for the following financial year at the same meeting that the budget and precept is approved. This is to ensure that activity is aligned with the budget setting process.
- 7. As in previous years, the draft work programme has been produced in a spreadsheet format to show the following see appendix 1:
 - Each proposed action has been listed under one of nine thematic headings, together with the relevant management plan objective and location details.
 - The actions have been prioritised as follows: 1 = highest priority, 2 = medium priority, 3 = lowest priority. Priorities may need to change during the year depending on circumstances.
 - Tree works, and items included in the grounds maintenance contract or as grounds maintenance day works are identified separately and costs provided where available. Projects, including those which are one off, are identified

separately. It should be noted that many of the actions will be carried out by volunteers, or by city council staff as part of their normal duties, so these items are not separately costed.

 The lead person(s) or organisation for each action is identified. The coloured chart depicts the proposed date range for the action and the individuals and/or organisations involved.

Rationale

- 8. Many of the proposed actions in the work programme consist of ongoing site management works and activities such as the annual programme of events. It is intended to at least maintain, and where possible expand, the levels of habitat management activity, infrastructure improvement and services to the public undertaken in previous years, subject to the availability of resources. This should be possible for the following reasons:
 - New ways of working, especially the greater availability and involvement of volunteer time, have reduced costs and enabled an increase in the amount of management work undertaken. It should be noted that organising volunteer work parties takes up a considerable amount of staff time, and this has only proved possible due to the current staffing establishment of two Mousehold wardens.
 - The use of contractors with specialist machinery has been increased, especially
 for heath land management. Also, the increased use of machine tools e.g.
 chainsaw and brush-cutter for use by the Mousehold wardens, has enabled many
 smaller tasks to be undertaken at lower cost and more efficiently.
 - It is hoped to continue to expand the amount of external funding available for management works and interpretation at Mousehold. For example, the Higher Level Stewardship (HLS) scheme is now entering its second year (this replaced the earlier Countryside Stewardship Scheme that had been in place on a small area of Mousehold since 2002). This has enabled expansion of existing open heath land areas and acidic grassland improving overall biodiversity of the site and supporting one-off habitat management projects.
- 9. In addition to regular work, several specific projects or one-off works are proposed in the 2014-15 work programme. These include:
 - The installation of two interpretation panels in a lectern style will be installed on the site of St. Williams Chapel and adjacent to the Pitch and Putt car park. Officers will be working in partnership with Norfolk County Council's historic environment officer who will be providing text and graphics along with the Mousehold Heath Defenders who will be financially supporting both projects. It is anticipated that the cost for both these projects will be covered from external funding and funds set aside within the works budget 2013-14 and 2014-15.
 - Heath land management: regular heath land management is carried out mainly by volunteers and the Mousehold Heath wardens, but the use of specialist machinery in 2013 and 2014 has enabled new areas of headland to be brought back into active management. It is proposed to use this machinery again in 2014/15, both for cutting and collecting vegetation and for removing the build up of humus that

- has prevented the regeneration of heather and other heath land plants with the aim of extending existing areas of open heath land areas.
- 10. Some of the site 'furniture' at Mousehold, notably bollards and roadside fencing preventing unauthorised vehicle access to the heath, is in need of replacement along with car park maintenance to improve visitor access. The cost of these replacement and repair works for 2014/15 is in the region of £5,000 8,000, depending on the number involved and this will be explored during 2014-15.
