The report of the Norfolk and Norwich El Viejo Friendship Link was presented by Ralph Gayton. He then provided an update on the following areas:

## 1. MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting hels on $29^{\text {th }}$ June, 2016 were confirmed by the Committee and signed by the Chairperson.

## 2. JAMIE-LOUISE MORRISON.

The Secretary reported that, unfortunately, Jamie Louise Morrison had suffered a family bereavement and was unable to attend the meeting to report on her recent three months working on a project in rural Nicaragua. She had stated that, if possible, she wold attend the Link meeting in September.

The Secretary's report was noted.

## 3. CORRESPONDENCE REPORT.

The Committee received the Secretary's report of correspondence with Carmela Hernandez, the Link's representative in Nicaragua, since the previous meeting.

The Secretary drew attention to Carmela's remarks about the earthquake which had struck off the coast or Nicaragua in the Gulf of Fonseca some 20 miles from the neighbouring municipality of Puerto Morazan. Apparently schools had been closed for a time but classes had now been resumed although there continued to be some aftershocks.

The Secretary drew attention to the messages concerning an international conference on twinning to take place in Managua on $15^{\text {th }} / 16^{\text {th }}$ July which would be dealt with later in the meeting.

The Correspondence Report was noted.

## 4. TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer presented her report which stated that the sum of $£ 130.00$ had been received since the previous report and $£ 50.00$ had been paid for annual affiliation to the Nicaragua Solidarity Campaign.

Banking arrangements. The Treasurer reported that all the necessary documentation had been submitted to the Cooperative Bank but there had been no response to date.

## 5. FUNDRAISING

(a) Sue Thomas reported that the Virgin Lounge in Davey Place had been booked for an event on $27^{\text {th }}$ October . there would be a reservation fee of $£ 100,00$ and Tony Bailey had agreed to raise this amount. Virgin staff would organise tickets for a $£ 5$ 'voluntary' donation' and they would also sell raffle tickets but a theme for the evening would be needed. It was agreed that the event be publicised as a 'Ukulele Night and Tony Bailey agreed to offer instruction on playing the ukulele. Tony and a friend would also play ukuleles for entertainment. Sue Thomas agreed to some training for events offered by Virgin.
(b) Use of Bishop's Garden. The Secretary reported that he had circulated the other three Twinning Organisations about organising an event in the Bishop's Garden in 2017. A reply had been received from the Norwich - Rouen Group agreeing to participate and the Committee of the Norwich - Novi Sad Association had also agreed to take part. There had been no response from the Koblenz twinning.

There was no formal application form but charities are asked to write a letter of application setting out why they are applying, what the money will be used for, and details about how they might run the day with the number of volunteers involved.
(c) Bike Ride: Sue Thomas reported that arrangements had been made for a sponsored bike ride on $24^{\text {th }}$ September, starting at UEA over a distance of 30 miles with shorter options of $7 \frac{1}{2}$ and 15 miles. It was agreed to circulate details to local cycle clubs explaining the purpose of the event.
(d) Give as you Live. Information had been received about a fund raising scheme called 'Give as you Live. The Treasurer reported that she was looking into the scheme which involved purchases made at over 4,00 stores across the country and would report to the next meeting of the Committee.

## 6. FIRST INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF TWINNINGS WITH MUNICIPALITIES MANAGUA - JULY 2018.

The Secretary drew the Committee's attention to a programme, laid on the table, for an international congress of municipalities involved in twinning in Nicaragua which had been organised by the Nicaraguan Government. He said this had originally been raised with him by our Representative in El Viejo with an invitation, apparently from the Alcalde of El Viejo, for him to 'attend a conference in July'. No further information had been provided and requests for clarification had not clarified the matter (see message (d) in the correspondence report at Item 4 of this agenda). It eventually transpired that the conference was being organised by the Nicaragua Government and would take place on $15^{\text {th }} / 16^{\text {th }}$ July in Managua.

The Secretary had indicated that he would not be able to attend such a conference at such short notice and on account of the costs involved. Eventually, and after consultation with the Link Chairperson, it was agreed that Carmela should attend as an observer and report back on the conference.

Carmela had subsequently sent a number of messages about the conference including a number of Power Point Presentations, in Spanish, relating to the topics in the programme.

The organisation of the Conference was, unfortunately, very poor. There are thirteen British twinnings with Nicaragua but it appears that only one, in London, received prior information about the Conference and they sent two councillors. The Secretary asked NSC in London if they could arrange for their local representative in Nicaragua to attend as a means of getting reliable information about the conference but unfortunately she was unable to attend because of sickness. The Secretary had asked our representative for is a list of organisation who were represented at the conference.

## 7. REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT.

The Committee received the report of the local representative, Carmela Hernandez, for the period March - June, 2016.

The School Gardens were being planted again with cucumber, pipian, beans, squash, peppers, and corn to augment food provided by the Government.

Money left from the budget amount for schoolbags and contents will be used to buy teaching material and cleaning material such as brooms, mops etc. which are not provided by the Ministry or the Alcaldia. Details of this expenditure will be included in the next report.

Under the heading 'Needs of the School' The School Committee drew attention to structural and other needs of some of the schools, such as damaged tiling, cracked walls, insecure gates, replacement of beams, need for whiteboards. They also asked for the repair of desks, repair of walls and floor, repair of windows, paint for ceilings.

The Committee pointed out that the sort of items mentioned in the then report under 'Needs of the School' are not provided for uncier the terms of the scholarship scheme and are properly the responsibility of the Government or the Alcaldia and that scholarship funds must not be used for those items. It was agreed that Carmela, and the School Committee be so advised.

## 8. REPRESENTATIVE'S ACCOUNTS.

The Committee received Carmela's accounts for the period April to June 2016.
The accounts showed expenditure for the period amounting to US $\$ 766,54$. It was also noted that Carmela had not claimed her salary for the months of May and June (Carmela had previously agreed to forgo her salary for April as she was out of the country visiting her daughter in Iceland).

The accounts were noted and it was agreed to remind Carmela about claiming her salary for May and June.

## 9. DATE OF NEXT MEETING.

It was agreed that the next meeting of the Committee be held on $2^{{ }^{5 t}}$ September, 2016.

## CORRESPONDENCE REPORT

The following exchanges of correspondence with our representative in EI Viejo have taken place since the last meeting of the Committee.
(a) Message 16-21 to Carmela sent $\mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ August 2016

Dear Carmela,
Thank you for your report for March - June which was considered by our Committee on 20 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ July.

1. School Gardens.

Our Committee was very pleased to learn that the school gardens continue to produce crops which are used to provide food for the children additional to the supplies from the Ministry. Please tell the children, and the teachers, that our Committee congratulates them on growing the crops which are used in their snacks at school.
2. Share of Schotarship Allowance.

Our Committee noted that the amount of $\$ 400$ has been allocated to the schools for the purchase of cleaning materials etc under group 2 of the scholarship funds as set out in the table in your report.
3. Needs of the Schools,

Our Committee took note of the various items listed in the section of your report headed 'NEEDS OF THE SCHOOL'.

Our Committee is concerned about the list of problems set out in your report but they point out that the various items listed under this heading concern structural and building maintenance problems which are outside the scope of the Scholarship Project. These items are the responsibility of the Ministry of Education and should be reported to the Minister. The Committee should also ask the Alcaldia for support in seeking remedial action by the Ministry.
4. The Earthquake.

Did any of the schools suffer any sort of damage, particularly structural damage, from the Earthquake? If they did, then this should be reported to the Ministry. Did anyone suffer injury caused by the earthquake?
5. The International Conference on International Twinning.

We are pleased that you attended the International Conference in Managua on $15^{\text {th }} / 16^{\text {th }}$ July and thank you for the various reports that you attached to your e-mail. They are being sent to our Committee.

Did the conference provide a list of those representatives who attended the Conference from outside Nicaragua? If there is such a list we would be very pleased if you could send us a copy. There are 13 UK twinnings with various places in Nicaragua but it appears that only one of them was represented at the Conference.
6. Your Salary.

Your Financial Report for April to June did not include any payment of your salary for the months of May and June. Please tell us why you have not claimed your salary for these two months. We understand that you were visiting your daughter in Iceland during April so you did not claim for that month but this does not explain why you did not claim for June/July.
7. Your Visit to Iceland.

We hope that you enjoyed your visit to your daughter in Iceland. No doubt it was very different to Nicaragua and much colder.
(b) Message 16-22 to Carmela sent $11^{\text {th }}$ August, 2016.

Dear Carmela,
I have not received any message from you since $19^{\text {th }}$ July. We hope you and your family are well and that all is well in El Viejo.

My wife and I will be away from home from today until the end of August so I will not be able to respond to any messages until we return.

The next meeting of our Committee will take place on $14^{\text {th }}$ September. Please send your report to me by $1^{\text {st }}$ September so that I can have it translated and circulated to the Committee by $7^{\text {th }}$ September.

I remind you that I still await the latrine reports for Francisco Morazan and Rosario Mayorga. Is there any reason why these reports are not available? If we are to take any action about the state of the School latrines it is essential that we have a complete picture of the situation. If there are not problems with the latrines at these two schools please tell us.

As you may know, the UK has decided to cease membership of the European Union following a national referendum. One of the results of this decision is that the value of the British Pound (£) has fallen against the US $\$$ from $\$ 1.50$ to US $\$ 1.30$. We are still assessing the result of this fall in value and how it may affect our funding. We will keep you informed.

It continues with visits to schools where small meetings are held with teachers and schoolchildren Rosario Mayorga, Morazán, Norwich, El Perpetuo, and Maritza to collect some history of children's lives that deserve to be counted. "Behind every face is a story, we say to the children" are going to make a story "

Another thing that I saw in schools that continue to operate the school places with great effort from teachers and students who care materials.

Continues being novelty and is good mention another time since it did in the report above is the importance of the school orchards since have had good harvest in some schools as the Morazan and the Evemilda that stand out this time.

Welcome to the August Newsletter, which covers the period from February to July 2016 and looks ahead to some of our future programme.

Friday 11 March. The 2016 programme started with the AGM at County Hall with 22 members present, and we were delighted to welcome our "Host", the Chairman of Norfolk County Council, Councillor Rex Parkinson-Hare and Mrs Margaret Parkinson-Hare, gratefully accepting the traditional venue, freely provided. Equally we felt very honoured by the presence of our Lord Mayor, Councillor Brenda Arthur.

The ideal facilities of the Edwards Room enabled us to display a selection of excellent enlarged photographs of Koblenz and its region taken by Alan Taylor, a prominent member of NNKFA, and also very much involved in the link between the Norwich and District Photographic Society and Foto Club Koblenz. Sadly he has since passed away, but he will be fondly remembered.


27 May, was a most welcome date in our diary of events, as it marked the visit of the Oberbürgermeister of Koblenz, Prof. Dr. Joachim Hoffmann-Göttig, accompanied by Günter Hahn, to help with translations, and his excellent driver Peter Lotak. The special NNKFA event was to welcome the group to lunch in the Cathedral Refectory, where we were pleased that Canon Andrew Bryant, who is the diocesan link with Koblenz, was able to join us. With all the extra civic activities including Mayor making and elections immediately before the visit, the visitors enthusiastically enjoyed the programme organised by the city for them, and the opportunity to be welcomed by our new Lord Mayor Councillor Marion Maxwell, and in his letter of thanks the Oberbürgermeister has invited her to make a return visit to Koblenz.

Saturday 18 June was our Summer Outing visit to Wrest Park, an English Heritage property in Bedfordshire, travelling "beyond our borders" was a memorable experience, and we were delighted that our Immediate Past Lord Mayor, Brenda Arthur-Horner and her husband Brian were able to join us. Although overcast, it remained dry, and the visit was much enjoyed by all.


The following report was compiled by Michael Salt.

Despite lowering grey skies with the promise of some rain on the journey, our party of 28 people left County Hall, our new departure point, on a Spratts coach driven by Mark.

Waltraud said, as we left, that Bedfordshire was beyond our normal Norfolk based summer expeditions but Wrest Park offered much out of the ordinary and would offer a change of scenery on the way.
Almost two hours later we arrived at Wrest Park and were able to walk directly to the house, where our Oxfordshire member, Mandy Keen, was waiting to join us.

The house had been used as a hospital during the First War. There were some fascinating displays of soldiers being nursed and convalesced. Particularly interesting was the extent of the entertainments and activities they were offered to keep up morale and speed their recovery, not least the opportunity to ride camels and ostriches! The NHS might have something to learn from that!

Unfortunately much of the house was destroyed by fire in 1916 and had to be evacuated. The last of the De Grey family, who owned the estate, was killed on the Western Front later that year. The estate was sold resulting in the loss of many artefacts that normally add to the delights of most stately homes. The most remarkable features of the house, the ceilings and pictures built into the walls have been preserved.
Earl de Grey who had rebuilt the house in the 1840's was passionately interested in design, particularly French styles and helped to produce many of the artistic features which set the house apart from others of that period. Two of the rooms that illustrate this splendour were being prepared for a Wedding so we were only able to walk through and take a brief glance.

De Grey was a practical man, too. The house had underfloor heating and beer from the brewery was piped directly into the house!!
The gardens and grounds are extensive and were designed in the eighteenth century. At that time they were managed by 24 gardeners, today there are only six, including apprentices but there are between 100 and 150 volunteers!


The magnificent vista from the veranda of the house is the Pavilion, about twenty minutes stroll away alongside a lake cum canal, a circular building where it was possible to entertain a few friends. There is an alcove which could be used as a small bedroom, with a fire and a mirror above it. There is also a large kitchen in the basement and servants quarters above, both reached by very steep, narrow staircases.
The house has had several owners over the years and came into the safe hands of English Heritage in 2006. They are doing all they can to preserve and share this remarkable heritage with the public.

As we drove home we were able to reflect that we had indeed, as Waltraud had forecast, experienced and enjoyed a fascinating place.


July15 to 19. To mark the Kemps Men's 60th Anniversary, they invited their long established friends the Winningen "Winzer Tanz und Trachtengruppe" to come to celebrate and dance with them and enjoy a few days in Norfolk. We welcomed them at Mosel, Keswick Road on their arrival in Norwich, as they were too early to go straight to the hotel and were fortunate to have a lovely sunny morning in the garden. On the Saturday they travelled with the Kemp's Men to Cromer by train, having first danced at Norwich Station. They were well received by visitors and residents in Cromer, and danced at various locations including in front of the pier. Our member Angela Bennett and lan took some video film of them there. On the Sunday they joined members of the Kemp's Men for the morning service at Norwich Cathedral,

before going to the Adam and Eve in Bishopgate for lunch, and then returning to the Bishop's Garden, which was open in aid of the Lymphoma Cancer Charity, where they and the Kemp's Men took it in turn to dance on the lawn. They were greeted there by the Lord Mayor of Norwich, and were also able to enjoy the beautiful garden. In the evening they enjoyed a barbecue at the home of Kemp's Man Pip Conrad and his wife, again fortunately a fine evening. On Monday, they set off for Walberswick and Southwold, only to find themselves delayed by the heavy traffic leaving the music festival. They and the Kemp's Men enjoyed a buffet lunch at The Bell, before dancing in the garden of the pub and then on the village green and then setting off on foot and by ferry or footbridge to the Green at Southwold, where they danced again before a large and appreciative audience. Supper and dancing again was in Oulton Broad before returning to Norwich. As they were not due to leave Norwich for Stansted until the Tuesday afternoon, they had an opportunity to enjoy the city. All the members who came to Norwich very much appreciated the hospitality and friendship, which they received. Much of the visit was organised by Peter Salt a longstanding member of the Kemp's Men.

July 21 to 27 Triorca Young Musicians, from Norwich, Norfolk and our twin cities and regions of Koblenz and Novi Sad travelled for the second time to Schloss Engers near Koblenz, for a residential course with concerts at Schloss Engers and the Görres Haus in Koblenz, the concert and practice hall used by the Rheinische Philharmonie Orchestra, and, when they visit Koblenz, the Norwich Philharmonic choir, to rehearse before their main concerts in the Rhein Mosel Halle. The visit seems to have gone extremely well and we have received an email from Juliet Rickard, organiser of music for the schools in Norfolk, with copies of very appreciative emails from Norfolk young musicians, who were invited to attend, and saying how much they felt they had gained from the visit and their time with the Norfolk Youth Orchestra, as well as musicians from other countries. It is hoped to hold the next Triorca training and concert in Novi Sad. Finance is always a problem with programmes of this Nature, but we and the Novi Sad association help with this through the Triorca Trust. We were delighted and grateful to receive £500 from the Norwich Twinning Committee towards the costs of this visit. We would like to hear of further possible sources of finance.


19 July: The Norwich and District Photographic Society Summer Exhibition was opened in the Cathedral Hostry, and included a tribute to Alan Taylor with a show of some of his old cameras and a display of four of his Koblenz pictures surrounded by pictures from members of the Fotoclub, Koblenz.

Sunday 18 September. Our annual "Birthday Lunch" will be at Park Farm, Hethersett, with a "welcome- Prosit" drink, this time with wine presented by the Oberbürgermeister of Koblenz.
Monday 28 November: Advent Evening will be at the Great Hospital. We hope to have members of the Cathedral Choir, as well as singing carols and enjoying German Christmas "Gebäck."

Activities. We continue with our weekly DUaM German Conversation every Wednesday 10.30 to 12.00 noon at $53 a$ Keswick Road, Cringleford, or if that is not possible other members houses. A contribution of $£ 1$ per person is given to our chosen charities "Meningitis Now" and "Feed the Minds of Millions"

Members also contribute to and support out annual "Feed the Minds" Book Fair, which was held 8 to 11 June and graciously opened by the Lord Mayor. " $£ 1800$ has been sent to Feed the Minds"
While we are still anticipating the new Twinning Display facility at City Hall, we are delighted that both the Norwich Society and Norwich in Bloom are actively looking for a new location for the Norwich Window, which was displayed in the Norwich Garden of the Bundesgartenshau in Koblenz in 2011.
We received a most gracious reply to our Special Greetings to the Queen on her 90th birthday.
We are confident that strong Twinning Links with European Cities will continue, despite the referendum vote to leave the European Union, and hope that the United Kingdom will continue to cooperate with the EU.
