Determination –

Members heard the proposals for opening an East European specialist shop at the location. In terms of the supply of alcohol there would be speciality alcoholic drinks for sale but the prices across the board were likely to be higher than supermarket prices. In answer to questions from members Mr Astrauskas confirmed that he would be the premises licence holder (rather than L&G Foods) and DPS.

Members questioned Mr Astrauskas about deliveries of goods to the premises. He explained that these would all be done at the rear of the premises. Mr Astrauskas described the training that his staff would be given to deal with problems at the premises. He had had no informal discussions with the police. In any event no responsible authorities had made any representations in relation to the licence.

There was no appearance from the interested persons. The licensing manager pointed out that some of the interested persons could not reasonably be described as living in the vicinity of the premises.

The Committee's decision:

Members resolved to grant the Licence as applied for.

Reasons

Members considered the application and noted that there were no representations from any of the responsible authorities. Members considered the concerns of the interested persons expressed on the petition. Having heard from Mr Astrauskas members were satisfied that the operating schedule was sufficient to deal with the issues raised and that it was not necessary in terms of the full licensing objectives to impose any further conditions on the Licence.

Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority

For your information, applicants and any person who has submitted a relevant representation, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition of any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
