NNNSA guided walk and talk on Eaton Park

On Friday, 30th June, a small group met at the Bandstand in Eaton Park for a quided tour of the park by Christine Wilson. We were invited into the Friends of Eaton Park room meetina where Christine showed archive plans and the photographs of early development of the park and referred to the work of the Parks Superintendent Captain Arnold Sandys-Winsch who was a key figure in the creation of Norwich parks.

At a time of depression and unemployment, over 100 men were employed to create the gardens, bandstand, pavilions, lily pond and model boating lake, as well all the green areas for bowls, cricket and over 40 tennis courts. The park was officially opened in 1928 by the then Prince of Wales. Christine explained how the Friends worked with the City Council and User groups to enhance use of the park, with groups of volunteers planting bulbs, litter-picking and raising funds for added amenities.

Local school children are encouraged to take part in environmental activities.

We were led on a gentle walk past the lily pond, down the avenue of hornbeams to the wild flower bed which was planted at the suggestion of the Friends of Eaton Park, admiring some of the many benches also provided by the Friends. In the formal garden we noted the introduction of decorative grasses around the more traditional lavender
