- 1. The Council has been formally consulted by the County Council on its proposals to create an Academy at Earlham High School. The closing date to respond is 13 February 2009.
- 2. The Scrutiny Committee has already decided to scrutinise the proposal and will be considering the matter on 12 February 2009.
- 3. When the Council was consulted on the proposal to create an Academy at the Heartsease High School the Executive asked the Scrutiny Committee to make recommendations to it on a proposed response.
