Subject Non Housing Capital Plan and Capital Programme

2011/12

Purpose

This report presents the proposed Non Housing Capital Programme for 2011/12 for approval, and reviews the Non Housing Capital Programme for 2010/11

Recommendations

To recommend Council to:-

- 1. approve the Non Housing Capital Programme 2011/12, as set out in the report
- 2. approve the following discretionary S106 expenditure provisions, and to delegate to the Capital Programmes Board the approval of detailed proposals in the form of Project Mandates when requirements have been fully worked up in conjunction with Members and other stakeholders.

Play and Open Space provisions

- a. Waterloo Park approval of an additional £30,000 provision for filtration equipment to the paddling pool, making the total project budget £209,000
- b. Pointers Field approval of an additional £20,000 towards a natural play park, making the total project budget £67,500
- c. NCCAAP bank addition of a further £12,873 to the Northern City Centre Area Action Plan S106 bank, making a total project budget to date of £89,057.
- d. Piling Park approval of £114,465 for improvements to play equipment and surfacing at Piling Park
- e. Chapelfield Gardens approval of an additional £9,977 S106 provision to allow improvement to lighting in the gardens associated with the play project, making a total budget of £201,544

Transportation provision

- Marriots Way improvements approval of an additional £4,404 to the budget for improvements to the cycle route, making a total project budget of £23,904
- b. Chapelfield North & Westlegate Traffic Circulation and Public Space Improvements approval of an additional £75,965 to the budget for this project, making a total S106 budget contribution of £82,320
- c. Edward Street Bus interchange approval of £13,838 contribution towards the cost of the interchange
- d. Chapelfield North & Westlegate Traffic Circulation and Public space improvements / Edwards Street Bus Interchange approval of a total

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- contribution of £146,184 towards one or both of these schemes from funds set aside for provision and maintenance of park and ride facilities
- e. Northern City Cycle Links approval of an additional £76,595 towards measures to encourage cycling and walking in the north of the City, making a total S106 contribution of £172,925
- f. Hurricane Way Bus link budget to remain as approved at £50,000, but source of funding to be amended as detailed in the report
- g. Magdalen Street Furniture and Signage review approval of £2,822 towards improvement of the pedestrian experience of Magdalen Street by the removal of unnecessary street furniture and signage
- h. Norwich River Parkway/Connect 2 approval of £6,519 contribution to this project
- Livestock Market Cycle and Walking Routes approval of £143,000 for additions and improvements to cycle and walking routes in the south of the city including improvements to Lakenham Way. This funding is held by Norfolk County Council.

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The Non Housing Capital Plan

- 1. The current uncertainty regarding the future of Local Government finances and recent reductions in revenue funding means that the Council needs to rethink its Capital Strategy, and in particular how this strategy impacts on revenue generation. Some of the largest contributions to revenue funding come from Investment income, or are generated by Council assets such as car parks..
- 2. As part of the Asset Management Strategy Improvement Plan the Council is undertaking a review of its investment portfolio and the income generated by assets. Until this review is completed the level of surplus capital receipts likely to be generated will be unknown.
- 3. Consequently this report only looks forward two years and predicts the currently known level of Capital receipts forecast to arise.
- 4. Table 1 indicates the anticipated levels of resources available to the Non Housing Capital Programme in the next two years.

5. Known resources include £2.5m grant from the HCA, carried forward into 2011/12. This funding is specifically for investment in the Bowthorpe site, to enable larger receipts to be generated from the development of that site in future years. The amount likely to be generated from the disposal of the site is subject to market forces and other issues, and therefore it would be unrealistic to include any estimates at present. Any receipts generated are required to be reinvested in the HCA partnership.

- 6. The sale of part of the Livestock market site and Earlham Hall have generated receipts which, when added to the forecast of a further £1.4m in 2011/12, provides a healthy balance of receipts available for the first time in several years.
- 7. However, the amount available to spend on new projects is subject to members decision on movements of funding between the General Fund and the HRA
- 8. In order to give maximum flexibility in the capital programmes it is assumed that housing right to buy receipts can be used for non housing capital expenditure.
- 9. Levels of further receipts likely to be available are unknown until the Asset Management Strategy Improvement Plan has been completed, hence the forecast above is only for disposals already identified.
- 10. The annual inflow of capital funding originating from S.106 developer contributions has continued to reduce during 2010/11. Contributions totalling £239K have been paid by developers in 2010/11 (2010 was £452K). The latest report to the Planning Applications Committee by the Head of Planning indicates that during the period April to December 2010 the number of planning applications received by the Council has increased by 9% over the corresponding period in 2009 but this increase in activity has not yet resulted in a significant increase in the pipeline of S.106 funds. There have been 14 S.106 agreements completed during the current financial year. (21 agreements were completed during the 2010 financial year).
- 11. Current market conditions continue to make it difficult to predict the timing of the receipt of future contributions. Signed S.106 agreements are attached to a number of larger schemes around the city including Anglia Square, St Annes Wharf, Duke Street, and Harford Place, but even if the existing planning approvals for these schemes are implemented it is unlikely that payment of the S.106 contributions will be triggered before 2013/2014.
- 12. In total the Council will carry forward approximately £2.37m of S106 resources in to 2011/12. Approximately £470K of this will remain unallocated to a specific scheme, if members approve the proposals in this report.

Review of Non Housing Capital Programme 2010/11

13. Table 2 summarises the anticipated outturn figures for the 2010/11 Non Housing Capital Programme.

- 14. The allowance for development of the Asset portfolio was not spent as no schemes were brought forward in advance of the Asset Management Strategy Improvement Plan
- 15. Expenditure on two HCA funded projects, the Memorial Gardens and the Skatepark was higher than the approved budget due to an underspend in 2009/10 and funding from the HCA was brought forward to cover this.
- 16. The major repairs programme is underspent but this is entirely due to being unable to identify sufficient schemes qualifying for capital funding with a high enough priority. Many of the high priority schemes are classified as revenue, and therefore funded as such.
- 17. The provision for tennis courts is unspent because of delays in obtaining matching funding from the Lawn Tennis Association and will be carried forward to the 2011/12 programme, together with a new proposal for further funding to match the promise of increased external funding
- 18. The provision for the purchase of waste collection equipment has not received any capital funding as it falls outside the definition of capital.
- 19. Section 106 expenditure was lower than anticipated. The underspend can be largely attributed to delays experienced in the implementation of approved schemes at St Clements Park, Waterloo Park, Stirling Road and Chapelfield Gardens.
- 20. There were some S106 schemes that were approved by Executive/Cabinet during the course of 2010/11 which were in addition to the identified budgets. These are shown in Table 3

Capital Programme 2011/12

- 21. With the outcome of the Asset Management Strategy Improvement Plan not yet known, this report only includes a forecast of expenditure for 2011/12.
- 22. In November 2010 senior officers conducted a review of capital expenditure requirements and prioritised potential projects on grounds of impact on Council Strategies, deliverability and potential funding sources.
- 23. This review only identified a few schemes that were critical on health and safety, statutory or legal grounds, or essential to protect significant revenue streams
- 24. The proposed Capital Programme for 2011/12 is restricted to projects which have been identified within the above criteria, some of which will be funded from the capital element of the major repairs programme, which it is proposed to remain at its normal budgeted level of £750k, including fees.
- 25. In addition the provision of a further £350k has been identified as necessary to cover major structural repairs to the River Wall at New Mills Yard.

27. This will leave a surplus of approximately £5.2m, excluding S106 funds which will be available to fund the Asset Management Strategy Improvement Plan, once the review is complete and a report setting out a revised capital programme will be presented to council in July 2011. It is anticipated that further funding to support the programme will be generated from a programme of disposals.
