Background

- 1. Roadworks are a source of frustration and inconvenience to road users but they are an essential operation and need to be managed carefully to minimise their impact on the travelling public.
- 2. There are 2 main originators of roadworks; The Highway Authority and public utility companies. Norfolk County Council has a responsibility to improve and maintain the highway, while the public utility companies have a responsibility to provide and maintain their infrastructure, the vast majority of which is located under the highway. From time to time developers are also required to work in the highway, carrying out improvements to facilitate access to their developments.
- 3. The table attached as appendix 1 sets out the current works that are have been completed since your last meeting, are currently in progress or are planned for the future on the A, B and C class roads within the city. - 4. The more significant schemes are highlighted below.

Vulcan Road South

- 5. On 21 February BT closed Vulcan Road South to move an underground chamber; work that was required by the construction of an entrance to the new KFC outlet on the ring road. The closure was planned to take 8 weeks. This has generated a significant number of complaints in the area and resulted in long delays for traffic using the Fifers Lane / Vulcan Road / Hurricane Way junction.
- 6. BT are making good progress with the work and it at the time of writing the report (12 March) it is anticipated that the road could be opened up to traffic exiting the industrial area within a matter of days, with a full re-opening following within a couple of weeks(ahead of schedule)
- 7. An oral update will be provided at your meeting.

LED Signal Retrofit programme

8. Norfolk county council are currently working on a programme of replacing all signal head aspects with LED units at all signalled junctions and crossings in the county. This will significantly reduce the power consumption of all traffic signals, and therefore the running costs. At each site it will be necessary to turn the traffic signals off during the switchover; at pelican and toucan crossings this is expected to take less then an hour, while junctions may take up to half a day depending on the complexity and number of signal heads. The work will be programmed to minimise disruption to traffic and consideration is being given to working on some of the major junctions in the city, such as Agricultural Hall

Plain overnight.

Finklegate

- 9. At the end of December 2010 Finklegate was closed to vehicular traffic when the road and some adjoining properties showed signs of subsidence. At the beginning of December 2011, following completion of all the necessary investigation works the road was re-opened in a one-way direction from Ber Street to Queens Road.
- 10. The building most affected by the subsidence is now in the process of being demolished. Once this is complete engineers will be able to properly assess what work is needed to be done to repair the carriageway. It is hoped that the full re-opening of the road will happen within the coming months.
