Scrutiny committee draft work programme 2013 - 2014

Purpose

The committee is requested to comment on the emerging work programme which is attached and agree on the final scope of topics.

Conclusion The topics that were selected by members at the 6 June meeting are provisionally timetabled as per the attached work programme. This programme is currently being discussed with officers to ensure that each topic is timetabled at the optimum time for scrutiny involvement and to fit with the cabinet's forward agenda and strategic planning of the council. Initial consultation has suggested the scheduling as laid out on the draft work programme.

Recommendations that the scrutiny committee;

- a) notes the progress being made with the work programme
- agrees the final scope of the topics on the work programme b)
- to decide which of the two options for welfare reform c) scrutiny to undertake in October.

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- Scrutiny topics agreed at 6 June meeting for the 2013 2014 work programme, provisional scheduling and purpose of scrutiny
- 1.1 The work programme has a reason for the topic request and outcome sought column. This column provides the scope of the topic and is used by officers to ensure that their reports address the issues that the scrutiny committee wishes to look at. The wording is based upon the initial discussions when topics were raised.
- 1.2 The provisional suggestions, purpose of the scrutiny and scheduling of topics is as follows:
- 1.3 **July Switch and save**; any lessons learned for switch and save moving forward.
- 1.4 **September Revenues and benefits performance**; to review the progress of the implementation plan; the response to welfare reform and universal credit and consider a case study.
- 1.5 **October Welfare reform**; at the 11 April meeting of the scrutiny committee members resolved to agree the scope of the scrutiny of welfare reform at a work shop arranged for the purpose which was held before the 6 June meeting of the committee.

The work shop was attended by Councillors Storie, Galvin, Brociek – Coulton, Stephenson, Howard and Brimblecombe.

The outcome of the work shop was that the scrutiny committee should consider looking at either

overview of the council's preparedness for dealing with the implications of welfare reform

Or

 how the council may work with other bodies in addressing fairness and inequality issues in Norwich. In doing so, invite Norfolk Community Advice Network (NCAN)

NCAN is a registered charity that offers welfare benefits representation, debt advice, domestic abuse advice and support, advice and representation for migrant workers on their employment and benefit rights, and free legal advice.

1.6 **November - City deal**; to gain an overview and to comment on the accountability aspects of the city deal. It is thought that November sits between ministerial sign off of the proposal and the subsequent detailed negotiation with government departments to agree the detail.

Also; **Annual housing report and housing review**; annual update/overview with the annual report being presented by tenant representatives.

1.7 December - Quarters 1 and 2 performance monitoring; in line with the decision made at the 6 June meeting of the scrutiny committee where it was decided that performance monitoring data be taken on a 6 monthly basis. Purpose – identification of any causes for concern and to note successes.

Also; **annual overview of the corporate plan**; for the scrutiny committee to gain an overview and refresh their knowledge of the corporate plan prior to pre scrutiny of the proposed policy and budget framework.

- 1.8 **January pre scrutiny of the proposed policy and budget framework**; to comment on the proposed budget and make suggestions to cabinet regarding the proposed budget's ability to deliver the priorities of the council.
- 1.9 **February Healthy city**; In November 2012, the scrutiny committee held a discussion on inequality and deprivation in Norwich. As part of the discussion members requested a future overview of progress being made between partners and the council and resolved that it should be considered within the Healthy City Programme the council continues to look at how it can support with partners evidence based solutions to address health inequalities in Norwich. Officers were also requested to look at how the scrutiny committee could scrutinize the Norwich 'healthy city' programme as it develops and in the longer term.

This work area for scrutiny could dovetail in with the welfare reform work suggested above at 1.5, second bullet point.
