Subject Appointment of an interim chief finance officer and section

151 officer

Purpose

To consider the appointment of an interim chief finance officer and section 151 officer. The S151 officer is one of three statutory roles that the council must have in place.

Recommendation

To confirm the appointment of Annabel Scholes as interim chief finance officer and section 151 officer.

Corporate and service priorities

The report helps to meet the corporate priority a healthy organisation

Financial implications

The estimated costs for the appointment to the end of March 20201 are £115,000. Of this cost, £55,000 will be met from the existing 2020/21 salary budget for the role, and £23,000 (equivalent to 1 day a week) will be recharged to the existing project budget for the joint venture insourcing (funded overall from the council's invest to save reserve). The remaining additional cost of £37,000 will be funded from the general fund contingency allocation. As with all corporate services, a proportion of the costs will recharged to the housing revenue account at the year-end.

- Section 151 of the Local Government Act 1972 requires that every local authority shall make arrangements for the proper administration of their financial affairs and shall secure that one of their officers has responsibility for the administration of those affairs. This officer in the case of Norwich City Council is the chief finance officer (CFO).
- 2. Appendix 9a, Paragraph 1 of the constitution states that proper officers are appointed by full Council. The chief finance officer is a proper officer.
- 3. The chief finance officer and S151 officer was provided by Cambridgeshire County Council up to 31 March 2020, under a delegation of function agreement. Interim arrangements have been in place since December 2019 following the resignation of the previous post holder and pending the function returning to the City Council from 1 April 2020. Those interim arrangements have now come to an end.
- 4. A meeting of Cabinet on 9 September 2020 gave support to the chief executive to commence consultation on proposed changes to the senior management structure. The proposals impact on the role of chief finance officer and S151 officer and it is therefore not appropriate to recruit to the role on a permanent basis until that process has concluded.
- 5. This report seeks authority to appoint Annabel Scholes as interim chief finance officer and S151 officer with immediate effect and pending the conclusion of the senior management review.
- Annabel Scholes is a qualified member of CIPFA. She has substantial
 experience in director level finance roles in local government; including with city
 and county councils and London boroughs, and has previously held S151 and
 deputy S151 positions.
