The Committee noted the representations from interested parties and found that the tenants had breached the license condition that "music and other amplified sound, shall be inaudible at the perimeter of the property". However, they took into account the efforts already made by the tenants prior to the review hearing to remedy this. This included a change of main use of the P.H to a restaurant and that there had been no live music events since this had been done.

The tenants amended their operating schedule to include the four conditions listed at page 16 of the report , these included the use of a sound limiter. They also amended their schedule to limit the number of live music events to a maximum of 24 per year.

Determination –

The Committee took no action.

The Committee's reasons:

The committee decided that the tenants were making real efforts to remedy the problems and with the amendments to the operating schedule it was thought to be unlikely that the problems would re-occur
