Determination -

The Committee noted that the front door needed to be fixed in order that it closed properly. That the Licensee needed to ensure that the windows were closed as per the conditions of the licence, and the enforcement team would check this.

The use of and enforcement of the use of the rear to the premises had been clarified so that Mr De'Ath could use the canvas covered area at the rear of his premises until 01.00hrs and that this was hoped would encourage patrons away from the front of the public house.

The Committee's decision:

The Committee:

The Committee decided to grant the variation and the licence now includes a condition that tables and chairs may be used at the front of the premises until 23.00hrs.

The Committee's reasons:

Public opinion had been sufficiently canvassed in addition to the application being reported in the local newspaper.

That 7 objections had been received after 39 letters notifying the application had been sent out.

That there had been no representations from the relevant authorities.

That the photographs supplied by an objector were taken on a Saturday night and did not show large numbers of people at the front of the public house.

Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant representation, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
