## Notice of Determination

**Determination –**

1. The Committee noted that there were no objections from responsible authorities such as the Norfolk Constabulary and that the requested sale by retail of alcohol was for consumption on the premises only.

**The Committee's decision:**

The committee granted a premises licence to the University of East Anglia for the licensable activities sought on the days and for the hours requested.

The Committee noted the opening hours of the premises are 10:00hrs to 23:30hrs every day.

**The Committee's reasons:**

The reasons for the Committee's decision were:-

The Committee noted the concerns of local residents regarding their fears of an increase in noise nuisance and disturbance but felt there was no evidence before the Committee to show the granting of the premises licence as sought, for these uses at this location, would increase the anti-social behaviour complained of. There were to be no off sales of alcohol, the operating schedule noted that alcohol was to be sold to ticket holders for performances only and the Norfolk Constabulary were not objecting to the request. The Committee took account of its obligations to determine the application for the premises licence in accordance with the promotion of the licensing objectives and did not feel that any of the licensing objectives would be compromised by the terms of the premises licence.

### **Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority**

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant representation, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition of any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
