

Notice of Determination

Determination -

The Committee noted that the applicant requested the sought licensable activities to take place between 1200 - 2300 hours every day and the operating schedule was amended accordingly.

The Committee's decision:

The Committee being familiar with the area found the following facts:-

- 1. That the applicant had proposed adequate controls in respect of noise from recorded music, noting the structure of the premises and the indoor use.
- 2. That the sought hours for the activities of recorded music (indoors only) and the sale by retail of alcohol (for consumption on the premises only) were satisfactory.
- 3. That the premises could safely accommodate off-street car parking for approximately 5 vehicles.

The Committee's decision was to approve the sought licensed activities at the proposed standard days and hours sought with the imposition of the following conditions:-

- 1. There will no takeaway use at the premises.
- 2. A sign will be displayed both in the car park and in the lobby of the premises requiring patrons to have consideration for local residents when leaving the premises.

Committee noted the sought opening hours of the premises.

The Committee's reasons:

The reasons for the Committee's decision were:-

Committee was concerned at the likely problems of noise nuisance and parking difficulties likely to arise from the frequent vehicle movements associated with a takeaway use and so imposed a condition prohibiting takeaway use. The Committee was concerned about the situation of the premises close to residential properties and felt it was appropriate to impose a condition requiring persons using the premises to have consideration for local residents for the purpose of preventing public nuisance. The Committee noted the physical situation of these premises at a junction whilst also being aware of the provision of on-street car parking spaces, public transport links and the location of the nearest bus station.

Right of a Party to appeal against the determination of the Authority

For your information, applicants and any party who made a relevant representation, or submitted an objection notice, who is aggrieved by the decision, or the imposition of any term, condition or restriction, have a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they are notified of the decision.
